Brain Injury Defined

Acquired Brain Injury (ABI


Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI)

Non-Traumatic Brain Injury

External Events: assault, fall, blast injury, motor vehicle crash

Internal Events: stroke, tumor, anoxia, aneurysm, infection

Leading Causes of TBI



Severity Continuum

Mild

75-90% cases
LOC less 30min
Up to 15% have long term impairments

Moderate

10-30% cases
LOC between 30min-24hrs
Up to 30-50% have long term impairments

Severe

5-10% cases
LOC greater 24hrs
Up to 80% have long term impairments

Impact of Brain Injury

Common cognitive impairments include:

Poor concentration

Decreased attention

Memory difficulties

Impaired judgment

Reduced ability to follow instructions

These cognitive deficits are consistently associated with poor functional outcomes in:

Social interaction

Problem solving


Skill acquisition

Occupational performance






BI Prevalence within Special Populations
