## Examples of Other State Ethics Commissions Oversight of Executive Branch Employees

- 1. <u>Hawaii State Ethics Commission</u> has authority over public officers and employees (including executive branch employees), which includes political subdivisions in the areas of gift rules, campaign disclosures, and lobbying.
- 2. <u>Montana Commissioner of Political Practices</u> is responsible for enforcing ethics complaints against state officers, legislators, and state employees. Mont. Code Ann. § 2-2-136.
- 3. <u>New Mexico Ethics Commission</u> oversees public officials, public employees, candidates, person subject to the Campaign Reporting Act, government contractors, lobbyists, lobbyist's employer or a restricted donor subject to the Gift Act.
- 4. <u>Nevada Commission on Ethics</u> has a code of ethical standards that governs the conduct of public officers and employees, including executive branch employees.
- 5. <u>Ohio Ethics Commission</u> has jurisdiction limited to the executive branch and does not include members of the legislative branch. Ohio Rev. Code Ann. § 102.01.
- 6. <u>South Dakota Government Accountability Board</u> was created in 2017 and was created by the Board to review and investigate allegations of misconduct by certain people: (1) any person holding a statewide office and (2) Any employee of the executive branch.
- 7. <u>Texas State Ethics Commission</u> has jurisdiction to enforce specific ethics code that apply to state employees (including executive branch employees).
