

Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman and members of the committee. I'm Brad Schaffer, Interim Director of Motor Vehicle for the North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT). I'm here to provide neutral testimony for HB 1169.

House Bill 1169 allows an individual who has limited mobility to have one set of plates for a vehicle where they are not listed as the owner, but use it as transportation. Current law allows for an individual with mobility impairment to have a license plate which includes the international symbol of accessibility for mobile impairment on each vehicle they are listed as owner of, as well as one placard which can be transferred between vehicles. The Motor Vehicle Division will need to update a form to comply with this change, but no additional system changes would be required.
