4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-07-01.5 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

54-07-01.5. Governor to file bills with secretary of state <u>and return vetoed bills to</u> house of origin.

- 1. When the legislative assembly is in session, within three legislative days after the bill has been delivered to the governor:
 - a. The governor shall cause file with the secretary of state each bill passed by the legislative assembly and not vetoed by the governor to be filed with the secretary of state within five legislative days after the bill has been delivered to the governor.
 - b. For a bill vetoed in full, the governor shall return the bill to the secretary of the senate or the secretary's designee, if the bill is a senate bill, or to the chief clerk of the house of representatives or the chief clerk's designee, if the bill is a house bill, together with the governor's statement of objections to the bill.
 - c. For a bill subject to an item veto, the governor shall strike on the face of the bill the language to which the governor objects and return the bill to the secretary of the senate or the secretary's designee, if the bill is a senate bill, or to the chief clerk of the house of representatives or the chief clerk's designee, if the bill is a house bill, together with the governor's statement of objections to the bill.

1 If the legislative assembly is not in session, the within fifteen days, Saturdays and 2 Sundays excepted, after the bill has been delivered to the governor: 3 <u>a.</u> The governor shall cause file each bill delivered topassed by the legislative 4 assembly and not vetoed by the governor to be filed with the secretary of state 5 within fifteen days, Saturdays and Sundays excepted, after delivery of the bill to-6 the governor. 7 For a bill vetoed in full, the governor shall file the bill, together with the governor's b. 8 statement of objections to the bill, with the secretary of state. The governor also 9 shall file a copy of the governor's statement of objections with the director of the 10 legislative council or the director's designee. 11 For a bill subject to an item veto, the governor shall strike on the face of the bill <u>C.</u> 12 the language to which the governor objects and file the bill, together with the 13 governor's statement of objections to the bill, with the secretary of state. The 14 governor also shall file a copy of the marked up bill and the governor's statement 15 of objections with the director of the legislative council or the director's designee. 16 <u>3.</u> For an item veto, the language struck on the face of the bill represents the vetoed 17 item, regardless of any conflicting statements provided in the governor's statement of 18 objections to the bill.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
