6		TION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 12-44.1-24 of the North Dakota Century Code is-

10	1 I	Prescribe rules establishing minimum standards for the construction, operation, and

12	<u> </u>	Prescribe rules for the care and treatment of inmates.	
13	<u>3. [</u>	Provide instruction to public and private correctional facilities on the correct	
14	ć	assessment and billing of medical care costs for medical care and treatment provided

16	<u> 4. (</u>	Cause rules and regulations to be made available to inmates or be posted in at least	
17	ę	one conspicuous place in each correctional facility.	
18		4.5. Appoint a correctional facility inspector qualified by special experience, education,	
19	ŧ	or training to inspect each correctional facility at least once each year to determine if	
20	t	the rules and regulations have been complied with. Inspection must include health and	

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1	safety, fire and life safety, security, rehabilitation programs, recreation, treatment of
2	persons confined, and personnel training.
3	SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - HEALTH CARE SERVICES IN
4	LOCAL CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES.
5	1. During the 2025-26 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying health
6	care services in local correctional facilities. The study must include:
7	a. A review of current state and federal requirements of local correctional facilities
8	regarding health care services;
9	b. A review of health care services funding patterns for local correctional facilities;
10	c. A consideration of the challenges of local health care facilities and providers in
11	serving incarcerated individuals in local correctional facilities;
12	d. An analysis of models of best practices for health care services for incarcerated
13	individuals in local correctional facilities; and
14	e. A consideration of methods to expand local, state, and federal funding for health
15	care services in local correctional facilities.
16	2. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations together
17	with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the seventieth
18	legislative assembly.
