- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of job service North
- 2 Dakota; and to provide an exemption.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from other funds derived from special funds and
federal funds, to job service North Dakota for the purpose of defraying the expenses of
job service North Dakota, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027,
as follows:

1	SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO					
2	SEVENTIETH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time funding					
3	items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act which are not included in the entity's					
4	base budget for the 2027-29 biennium and which the entity shall report to the appropriations					
5	committees of the seventieth legislative assembly regarding the use of this funding:

9	SECTION 3. NEW AND VACANT FTE POOL - LIMITATION - TRANSFER REQUEST. Job					
10	service North Dakota may not spend funds appropriated in the new and vacant FTE pool line					
11	item in section 1 of this Act, but may request the office of management and budget to transfer					
12	funds from the new and vacant FTE pool line item to the salaries and wages line item in					
13	accordance with the guidelines and reporting provisions included in House Bill No. 1015, as					
14	approved by the sixty-ninth legislative assembly.					
15	SECTION 4. ADDITIONAL INCOME - APPROPRIATION. All federal funds received by					
16	job service North Dakota in excess of those funds appropriated in section 1 of this Act are					
17	appropriated to job service North Dakota for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending					
18	June 30, 2027.					
19	SECTION 5. OTHER FUNDS - REED ACT FUNDS - UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE					
20	<b>COMPUTER MODERNIZATION.</b> The other funds appropriation in section 1 of this Act includes					
21	the sum of \$10,915,000 from federal Reed Act funds made available to the state by the federal					
22	Reed Act distributions made in federal fiscal years 1957, 1958, 1999, and 2002, pursuant to					
23	section 903 of the federal Social Security Act. This sum, or so much of the sum as may be					
24	necessary, is for the purpose of developing a modernization unemployment insurance computer					
25	system.					
26	SECTION 6. EXEMPTION - UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE MODERNIZATION					
27	PROJECT - FEDERAL STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND. The amount of \$45,000,000 from					
28	federal funds derived from the state fiscal recovery fund for the unemployment insurance					
29	modernization project in section 1 of chapter 16 of the 2023 Session Laws is not subject to					
30	section 54-44.1-11, and any unexpended funds from this appropriation may be continued and					
31	used during the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027.
