PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO FIRST ENGROSSMENT

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2018

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

In place of amendment (25.0185.02014) proposed in the journal by the House, Engrossed Senate Bill No. 2018 is amended by amendment (25.0185.02015) as follows:

- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
- 2 commerce; to provide an appropriation to the attorney general; to provide an appropriation to
- 3 the department of career and technical education; to provide a contingent appropriation; to
- 4 create and enact a new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 5 department of commerce grant reporting requirements; to amend and reenact
- 6 section subsection 1 of section 10-30.5-02, sections 54-60-09, 54-60-19, 54-60-28, 54-60-29,
- 7 <u>54-60-29.1, and</u> 54-60-31 of the North Dakota Century Code and section 3 of chapter 51 of the
- 8 2023 Session Laws and subsection 13 of section 9 of House Bill No. 1019, as approved by the
- 9 <u>sixty-ninth legislative assembly</u>, relating to the purpose of the North Dakota development fund,
- 10 duties and talent strategy of the division of workforce development, the uncrewed aircraft
- 11 systems program, the uncrewed aircraft systems program fund, the beyond visual line of sight
- 12 <u>uncrewed aircraft system program, changing the name of the office of legal immigration to the</u>
- 13 office of global talent office, and the Theodore Roosevelt presidential library project; to authorize
- 14 <u>a Bank of North Dakota line of credit</u>; to provide for a transfer; to provide an application; to
- 15 provide an exemption; and to provide for a legislative management report; and to declare an
- 16 <u>emergency</u>.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state

1 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from other funds derived from special funds and

2 federal funds, to the department of commerce for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the

3 department of commerce, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027,

4	department of commerce may not spend funds appropriated in the new and vacant FTE pool				
5	line item in section 1 of this Act, but may request the office of management and budget to				
6	transfer funds from the new and vacant FTE pool line item to the salaries and wages line item i	n			
7	accordance with the guidelines and reporting provisions included in House Bill No. 1015, as				
8	approved by the sixty-ninth legislative assembly.				
9	SECTION 4. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE -				
10	STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - CHILDREN'S EDUCATION				
11	SCIENCE CENTER GRANTS - ONE-TIME FUNDING. There is appropriated out of any money	's			
12	in the strategic investment and improvements fund, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of				
13	\$10,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of commerce for				
14	the purpose of providing grants of up to \$5,000,000 to support the construction of children's				
15	education science centers in cities in the state with a population of at least 50,000 residents, for				
16	the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. The funding appropriated in				
17	this section is available only if the state treasurer certifies to the office of management and				
18	budget that oil and gas tax revenue allocations to the strategic investment and improvements				
19	fund under section 57-51.1-07.5 have exceeded \$410,000,000 during the 2025-27 biennium.				
20	The appropriation in this section is considered a one-time funding item.				
21	SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS

24	1. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the strategic investment and				
25	improvements fund, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$250,000, or so much of				
26	the sum as may be necessary, to the attorney general for the purpose of providing				
27	autonomous technology grants to individuals or entities that aid the bureau of criminal	l			
28	investigation in conducting missing person searches, crime scene reconstruction, and	ł			
29	law enforcement first response operations, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025,				
30	and ending June 30, 2027. The appropriation in this section is considered a one-time				
31	funding item.				

- For purposes of this section, autonomous technology includes uncrewed aircraft
 systems; autonomous vehicles; or other autonomous systems, processes, or
 technologies.
- 4 The attorney general shall develop an application process and guidelines for the 3. 5 grants, including eligibility criteria, matching requirements, eligible uses of grant 6 funding, and maximum grant awards. To be eligible for a grant, an individual or entity 7 shall certify to the attorney general that the operation of the autonomous technology is 8 related to conducting missing person searches, crime scene reconstruction, and law 9 enforcement first response operations. The attorney general may require an individual 10 or entity to provide one dollar of matching funds for every four dollars awarded by the 11 state. An individual or entity may use grant funding for autonomous technology 12 operations, contracting for services related to autonomous technology, or other eligible 13 uses as determined by the attorney general.
- During the 2025-26 interim, the attorney general shall provide at least one report to the
 legislative management regarding the grants, including a list of grant recipients, the
 amounts awarded, and a description of the use of the grant funding.

17SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS18FUND - DEPARTMENT OF CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION - AUTONOMOUS

19 TECHNOLOGY GRANTS - MATCHING FUNDS REQUIREMENT - ONE-TIME FUNDING -

20 LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT REPORT.

- 21 1. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the strategic investment and 22 improvements fund, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$250,000, or so much of 23 the sum as may be necessary, to the department of career and technical education for 24 the purpose of providing autonomous technology grants to a workforce training center 25 serving the northwest area of the state for providing workforce training to address 26 workforce shortages in the state, including shortages in the oil and gas industry, for the 27 biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. The appropriation in this 28 section is considered a one-time funding item.
- 2. For purposes of this section, autonomous technology includes uncrewed aircraft
 30 systems; autonomous vehicles; or other autonomous systems, processes, or
 31 technologies.

8		require a workforce training center to provide one dollar of matching funds for every

11		autonomous technology operations, contracting for services related to autonomous	
12		technology, or other eligible uses as determined by the department of career and	
13		technical education.

15		provide at least one report to the legislative management regarding the grants,

23		ANK OF NORTH DAKOTA PROFITS TO THEODORE ROOSEVELT PRESIDENTIAL	
24	LIBRAR	RY AND MUSEUM ENDOWMENT FUND - MATCHING FUNDS REQUIREMENT. The	
25	office of	management and budget shall transfer \$25,000,000 from the strategic investment and	
26	improvements fund and the Bank of North Dakota shall transfer \$25,000,000 from the Bank's		
27	current earnings and undivided profits to the Theodore Roosevelt presidential library and		
28	museum endowment fund during the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30,		
29	2027. The moneys may be transferred only to the extent a private entity involved with a		
30	presidential library and museum in the state has secured matching funds from nonstate sources		
31	on a dol	lar-for-dollar basis for deposit into the endowment fund and only if the entity overseeing	

1	the Theodore Roosevelt presidential library certifies to the office of management and budget
2	that a policy has been enacted allowing admission to the presidential library without a fee for
3	individuals less than eighteen years of age.
4	SECTION 9. TRANSFER - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND TO
5	LEGACY INVESTMENT FOR TECHNOLOGY FUND. The office of management and budget
6	shall transfer the sum of \$5,000,000 <u>\$10,000,000</u> from the strategic investment and
7	improvements fund to the legacy investment for technology fund for the purpose of providing
8	legacy investment technology loans, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending
9	June 30, 2027.
10	SECTION 10. TRANSFER - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND TO
11	NORTH DAKOTA DEVELOPMENT FUND - EXEMPTION - MATCHING FUNDS
12	REQUIREMENT. The office of management and budget shall transfer the sum of \$30,000,000
13	from the strategic investment and improvements fund to the North Dakota development fund for
14	programs under chapter 10-30.5, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30,
15	2027. Notwithstanding section 10-30.5-02, the North Dakota development fund may use the
16	funds provided in this section for nonprimary sector business activities and for grants only to the
17	extent an eligible organization has secured matching funds from nonstate sources on a
18	dollar-for-dollar basis.
19	SECTION 11. BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA LINE OF CREDIT - TRANSFER TO NORTH
20	DAKOTA DEVELOPMENT FUND. The department of commerce may borrow up to
21	\$75,000,000 through a line of credit from the Bank of North Dakota during the biennium
22	beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027, the proceeds of which must be transferred
23	to the North Dakota development fund for programs under chapter 10-30.5. The interest rate
24	associated with the line of credit may not exceed the prevailing interest rate charged to North
25	Dakota governmental entities. The department of commerce shall repay the line of credit from
26	moneys available in the North Dakota development fund. If the moneys available in the North
27	Dakota development fund are not sufficient to repay the line of credit, the department of
28	commerce shall request a deficiency appropriation from the seventieth legislative assembly to
29	repay the line of credit.
30	SECTION 12. RURAL HEALTH CARE GRANT PROGRAM - MATCHING FUNDS

31 **REQUIREMENT.** The grants line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$444,000 from the

1	general fund for providing matching funds to an organization assisting in the recruitment,			
2	distribution, and supply, and enhancing the quality and efficiency of personnel providing health			
3	services	in rural areas of the state. The department of commerce may spend the funds		
4	appropri	iated in this section only to the extent the organization has secured matching funds from		
5	nonstate	e sources on a dollar-for-dollar basis.		
6	SEC	CTION 13. OTHER FUNDS - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS

5	The requirements of chapter 54-44.4 do not apply to the selection of a grant recipient, the grant
6	award, or payments made under this section.
7	SECTION 14. OTHER FUNDS - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS
8	FUND - UNCREWED AERIAL VEHICLE REPLACEMENT PROGRAM - LEGISLATIVE
9	MANAGEMENT REPORT. The other funds line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of
10	\$16,000,000 which the department of commerce shall use for the purpose of administering an
11	uncrewed aerial vehicle replacement program, for the period beginning with the effective date of
12	this Act, and ending June 30, 2027.
13	1. The department of commerce shall collaborate with the uncrewed aircraft systems test
14	site established in section 54-60-28 and state agencies, including institutions under
15	the control of the state board of higher education, to replace uncrewed aerial vehicles
16	owned by the state which do not comply with requirements of the federal National
17	Defense Authorization Act and the American Security Drone Act of 2023. The
18	information technology department, in consultation with the department of commerce
19	and the uncrewed aircraft systems test site, may implement an enterprise uncrewed
20	aerial vehicle data management solution. An enterprise uncrewed aerial vehicle data
21	management solution implemented under this section must ensure all data collected,
22	transmitted, stored, and consumed by an uncrewed aerial vehicle remain under the
23	control of the state. As used in this section "enterprise uncrewed aerial vehicle data
24	management solution" means a system for secure, end-to-end data collection,
25	transportation, storage, processing, and consumption through enterprise software. A
26	state agency owning an uncrewed aerial vehicle before January 1, 2025, is eligible to
27	receive a new uncrewed aerial vehicle that is in compliance with federal requirements
28	and is of equivalent capability to the agency's existing uncrewed aerial vehicle. The
29	department of commerce shall purchase each uncrewed aerial vehicle based on the
30	needs of the agency and a recommendation from the uncrewed aircraft systems test
31	site and provide the uncrewed aerial vehicle to the agency. The department of

1		commerce shall use a portion of the funding provided in this section to pay for training		
2		needed for agency staff to operate the new uncrewed aerial vehicle. The department		
3		of commerce and uncrewed aircraft systems test site shall give priority to state		
4		agencies willing to share uncrewed aerial vehicles rather than purchasing multiple		
5		uncrewed aerial vehicles.		
6	2.	Any uncrewed aerial vehicle replaced under this section must be remitted to the		
7		uncrewed aircraft systems test site for proper decommissioning and disposal pursuant		

- 8 to federal and state regulations, which may include the sale of uncrewed aerial
 9 vehicles to the United States department of homeland security at market rates for use
 10 in the counter unmanned aircraft system program. The department of commerce shall
 11 remit any funding received under this section to the state treasurer for deposit in the
 12 general fund.
- 13 3. The department of commerce shall maintain an inventory of uncrewed aerial vehicles 14 purchased for state agencies under this section and encourage state agencies to use 15 the state beyond visual line of sight program. The uncrewed aircraft systems test site 16 shall provide guidance to state agencies regarding the integration of uncrewed aerial 17 vehicles into the beyond visual line of sight system and proper maintenance schedules 18 for uncrewed aerial vehicles. The uncrewed aircraft systems test site shall establish a 19 centralized system for state agencies to register uncrewed aerial vehicles and 20 authorized operators for accessing the beyond visual line of sight system and shall 21 provide operational support when state agencies use uncrewed aircraft systems test 22 site integrated platforms.
- 4. During the 2025-26 interim, the department of commerce shall compile information
 from state agencies and provide a report to the legislative management by June 30,
 2026, regarding the status of the program, funding spent on uncrewed aerial vehicle
 replacements and training costs, the number of uncrewed aerial vehicles replaced in
 each state agency, the number of uncrewed aerial vehicles sold or disposed, and any
 future needs for each state agency to be compliant with the federal National Defense
 Authorization Act and the American Security Drone Act of 2023.
- 30 SECTION 15. TRIBALLY CONTROLLED COMMUNITY COLLEGE GRANTS -
- 31 **LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT REPORT.** The grants line item in section 1 of this Act includes

1	\$750,000 from the general fund for the purpose of providing workforce development grants to a
2	tribally controlled community college in the Turtle Mountain area. To be eligible for a grant under
3	this section, a tribally controlled community college shall partner with at least one high school in
4	the state for programs under section 54-60.2-02. During the 2025-26 interim, a tribally
5	controlled community college receiving funding under this program shall report to the
6	department of commerce by August 1, 2026, regarding the use of grant funds and the
7	department of commerce shall provide a report to the legislative management by October 1,
8	2026, regarding the use of grant funds.
9	
10	GRANT . The discretionary funds line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$2,150,000 from the
11	general fund, of which \$600,000 is designated for a grant to support an organization dedicated
12	to assisting Native American small businesses in North Dakota.
13	SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 10-30.5-02 of the North Dakota
14	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
15	1. It is the purpose of this chapter to create a statewide nonprofit development
16	corporation that will have the authority to take equity positions in, to provide loans to,
17	orto form a management and operations entity, and to use other innovative financing
18	mechanisms to provide capital for new or expanding businesses in this state, or
19	relocating businesses to this state. The corporation's principal mission is the
20	development and expansion of primary sector business in this state. The corporation
21	may form additional corporations, limited liability companies, partnerships, joint
22	ventures, or other forms of business associations in order to further its mission of
23	primary sector economic development.
24	SECTION 17. A new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
25	and enacted as follows:
26	Reporting requirements - Budget section - Grant programs.
27	The department shall compile a report regarding grant programs administered by the
28	department, excluding federally funded programs, to be provided semiannually to the budget
29	section. The report must include the following for each grant program:
30	1. The purpose of the grant program;
31	2. Funding history:
