- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 54 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to a state alert notice system; and to repeal sections 39-03-13.2 and 54-12-32 of
- 3 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the state's silver and blue alert notice systems.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new chapter to title 54 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 6 enacted as follows:

8 <u>As used in this chapter:</u>

- 9 <u>1.</u> "Amber alert notice" means an urgent bulletin using the emergency alert system to air
 a description of a child who has been abducted.
- 12 <u>2.</u> "Blue alert notice" means an urgent bulletin using the emergency alert system to air a
- 12 description of an individual or an individual's vehicle to aid in the apprehension of an
- 13 individual who has threatened a law enforcement officer with a deadly weapon, used a
- 14 deadly weapon against a law enforcement officer, caused a law enforcement officer to
- 15 <u>suffer serious bodily injury or death, abducted a law enforcement officer, or caused a</u>
- 16 law enforcement officer to go missing while on duty, and the individual has left the
- 17 <u>scene of the offense.</u>
- 18 <u>3.</u> <u>"Missing endangered individual" means:</u>
- 19a.A disabled adult or elderly vulnerable adult as defined in section 50-25.2-01 who20has disappeared and whose disappearance has been reported to law21enforcement;

17				particular circumstances warrant a silver alert notice activation.

4			determines sufficient descriptive information has been provided about the child,		
5			the abductor, or the abductor's motor vehicle to:		
6			(1) Assist with the safe recovery of the child;		
7			(2) Assist with the apprehension of the abductor; and		
8			(3) Believe an immediate broadcast alert will assist in the search for and safe		
9			return of the child.		
10	<u>2.</u>	<u>A bl</u>	lue alert notice may not be activated unless:		
11		<u>a.</u>	An individual who is a suspect in an offense has threatened a law enforcement		
12			officer with a deadly weapon, used a deadly weapon against a law enforcement		
13			officer, caused a law enforcement officer to suffer serious bodily injury or death,		
14			abducted a law enforcement officer, or caused a law enforcement officer to go		
15			missing while on duty;		
16		<u>b.</u>	The individual has fled the scene of the offense and a description of the individual		
17			or the individual's vehicle is available for broadcast;		
18		<u>C.</u>	The law enforcement agency investigating the offense has determined the		
19			individual poses a threat to the public or other law enforcement personnel; and		
20		<u>d.</u>	Dissemination of available information to the public may help avert further harm		
21			or assist in the apprehension of the suspect.		
22	SECTION 2. REPEAL. Sections 39-03-13.2 and 54-12-32 of the North Dakota Century				
23	Code are repealed.
