1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 23-12 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to recording and reporting vaccine adverse event data; to amend and

3 reenact section 23-12-22 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the publication of

4 vaccine adverse event data and information; to provide for a legislative management report; to

- 5 provide an appropriation; to provide a continuing appropriation; and to provide an expiration
- 6 date.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 23-12-22 of the North Dakota Century Code is

9 amended and reenacted as follows:

10 23-12-22. Vaccine adverse event data - Website.

- 11 <u>1.</u> The department of health and human services shall prominently:
- 12a.Prominently display, on a website maintained by the department, a link to the13federal vaccine adverse event reporting system, along with instructions on how to14report an adverse event and how to access state-specific data. The department-15may compile its own data for use on this website.; and
- b. Provide information about the vaccine adverse event data system maintained by
 the department under section 2 of this Act, including recording and reporting
 requirements for health care providers.

 <u>2.</u> The department of health and human services may compile its own data for use on its website.

SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 23-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
 and enacted as follows:

4		<u>a.</u>	"Department" means the department of health and human services.		
5		<u>b.</u>	"Health care provider" means a licensed individual or facility providing health care		
6			services.		
7		<u>C.</u>	"Vaccine" means a vaccine recommended by the federal advisory committee on		
8			immunization practices of the centers for disease control and prevention.		
9		<u>d.</u>	"Vaccine administration error" means a preventable event that may cause or lead		
10			to inappropriate vaccine use or patient harm. The term includes administering a		
11			wrong or expired vaccine; using the incorrect route, site, or dosage; scheduling		
12			errors; improper preparation or storage; and administering a vaccine to the wrong		
13			individual.		
14	<u>2.</u>	The department shall:			
15		<u>a.</u>	Establish and administer a system to record and compile reported vaccine		
16			adverse event data;		
17		<u>b.</u>	Designate the adverse events a health care provider shall report to the		
18			department, including:		
19			(1) An adverse event required to be reported under the National Childhood		
20			Vaccine Injury Act of 1986 [Pub. L. 99-660; 100 Stat. 3774; 42 U.S.C.		
21			<u>300aa-25 et seq.]; and</u>		
22			(2) <u>A vaccine administration error;</u>		
23		<u>C.</u>	Establish time frames and methods for reporting;		
24		<u>d.</u>	Develop forms for reporting;		
25		<u>e.</u>	Adopt rules necessary to implement this section; and		
26		<u>f.</u>	By July first of each even-numbered year, provide a comprehensive report to the		
27			legislative management, which includes a summary of all reported data and the		
28			overall effectiveness of the system.		
29	<u>3.</u>	<u>A h</u>	ealth care provider that administers a vaccine to an individual shall report every		
30		<u>000</u>	surrence of an adverse event to the department, on a form prescribed by the		
31		<u>dep</u>	partment.		

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1	<u>4.</u>	<u>A m</u>	ember of the public may report an adverse event to the department in a manner			
2		pres	scribed by the department.			
3	<u>5.</u>	<u>A re</u>	port required by this section and held by the department is confidential			
4		info	rmation. Unless otherwise provided by law, information that may identify an			
5		indiv	vidual may not be disclosed to any person except:			
6		<u>a.</u>	The individual who received the vaccine, or that individual's parent, legal			
7			guardian, or legal representative; and			
8		<u>b.</u>	For statistical purposes, in a manner such that personally identifiable information			
9			can not be identified.			
10	<u>6.</u>	<u>An c</u>	officer or employee of the department may not be examined in any judicial,			
11		<u>exe</u>	cutive, legislative, or other proceeding regarding the existence or content of any			
12		indiv	vidual's report retained by the department under this section.			
13	<u>7.</u>	<u>The</u>	re is created in the state treasury a vaccine adverse event data system fund. The			
14		fund consists of all moneys transferred to the fund and all interest and earnings upon				
15	moneys in the fund. Moneys in the fund are appropriated to the department on a					
16		con	tinuing basis for the purpose of administering the provisions of this chapter.			
17	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES -					
18	VACCINE ADVERSE EVENT DATA SYSTEM. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the					
19	general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$100,000, or so much					
20	of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of health and human services for the					
21	purpose of establishing and administering a system to record and compile reported vaccine					
22	adverse event data, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027.					
23	SECTION 4. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act is effective through June 30, 2029, and after that					
24	date is ineffective.
