- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15-10 and a new section to
- 2 chapter 15.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to displays of the ten
- 3 commandments in state educational institutions and public schools.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 7 <u>Ten commandments Displays.</u>
- 8 <u>1.</u> The state board of higher education shall display the ten commandments in each
- 9 <u>classroom on the campus of each state educational institution under its control and</u>
- 10 <u>administration.</u>
- 11 <u>2.</u> The display must be:
- 12 <u>a.</u> On a poster or framed document that is at least eleven inches [27.94]
- 13 <u>centimeters] in width and fourteen inches [35.56 centimeters] in length.</u>
- b. The central focus of the poster or framed document.
- 15 <u>c. Printed in a large, easily readable font.</u>
- 16 <u>3. The text must read as follows:</u>
- 17 The Ten Commandments
- 18 <u>I AM the LORD thy God.</u>
- 19 <u>Thou shalt have no other gods before me.</u>
- 20 <u>Thou shalt not make to thyself any graven images.</u>
- 21 <u>Thou shalt not take the Name of the Lord thy God in vain.</u>
- Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.
- Honor thy father and thy mother, that thy days may be long upon the land which the

15	<u>1.</u>	A board of a school district shall display the ten commandments in each classroom
16		and building on school grounds in the school district.
17	<u>2.</u>	The display must be:
18		a. On a poster or framed document that is at least eleven inches [27.94]
19		centimeters] in width and fourteen inches [35.56 centimeters] in length.
20		b. The central focus of the poster or framed document.
21		c. Printed in a large, easily readable font.
22	<u>3.</u>	The text must read as follows:
