A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation to the attorney general for purposes of conducting-

2 a foreign adversaries threat assessment; to provide for a legislative management report; and to

3 declare an emergency.

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## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - GENERAL FUND - ATTORNEY			
6	GENERAL DEPARTMENT OF EMERGENCY SERVICES - FOREIGN ADVERSARY THREAT			
7	ASSESSMENT - REPORT - ONE-TIME FUNDING - LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT REPORT.			
8	1. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027, there is			
9	appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise			
10	appropriated, the sum of \$3,200,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to			
11	the attorney general for the purpose of contracting with a consultant to perform a			
12	comprehensive assessment of the state's vulnerabilities relating to security threats			
13	posed by foreign adversaries. The funding provided in this subsection is considered a			
14	one-time funding item.

16	a. Identify sectors and industries most vulnerable to foreign adversarial influence,			
17	including critical infrastructure, technology, agriculture, energy, and academia;			
18	b. Assess foreign adversarial influence beyond land acquisition, including strategic			
19	investments, partnerships, and other forms of economic, educational, and			
20	political influence;			

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1		C.	Evaluate existing investments and activities to determine compliance with	
2			federal, state, and local laws;	
3		d.	Identify sectors in which foreign adversarial influence is often unmonitored or	
4			under reported; and	
5		e.	Propose broad mitigation strategies relating to identified risks and vulnerabilities	
6			to enhance the state's ability to manage foreign adversarial influence while	
7			supporting economic growth and security.	
8	<del>3.</del> 2.	By July 1, 2026, the consultant <u>department of emergency services</u> shall		
9		<del>pro</del>	<del>vide</del> produce a written report <del> to the attorney general</del> outlining its findings and	
10		rec	ommendations. The report must:	
11		a.	Provide a detailed analysis of the foreign adversary threats and vulnerabilities	
12			specific to the state;	
13		b.	Identify critical risks across sectors, including infrastructure, security, academia,	
14			and economic investments;	
15		C.	Provide sector specific mitigation recommendations designed to reduce	
16			vulnerabilities in infrastructure, academic institutions, economic investments, and	
17			other prominent sectors in the state; and	
18		d.	Include a proposal providing for the establishment of a state intelligence unit and	
19			the structure, roles, and operational procedures required for continuous	
20			monitoring of foreign adversary threats by the state intelligence unit.
