1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 39-06.1-06, subsection 3 of section 39-06.1-10,

2 sections 39-09-02, 39-09-04, and 39-09-07.1, and subsection 2 of section 40-05-06 of the North

3 Dakota Century Code, relating to the amount of statutory fees, points assigned to driving

4 records, speed limitations on multilane highways, variable speed limits, alteration of maximum

5 speed limits on state highways, speed zone reduction limitations, and city fines and penalties;

6 and to provide a penalty.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is

9 amended and reenacted as follows:

10 **39-06.1-06.** Amount of statutory fees.

11 The fees required for a noncriminal disposition under section 39-06.1-02 or 39-06.1-03 must 12 be as follows:

1 **39-09-02.** Speed limitations.

- Subject to the provisions of section 39-09-01 and except in those instances when a
 lower speed is specified in this chapter, it presumably is lawful for the driver of a
 vehicle to drive the same at a speed not exceeding:
- 5 a. Twenty miles [32.19 kilometers] an hour when approaching within fifty feet [15.24 6 meters] of a grade crossing of any steam, electric, or street railway when the 7 driver's view is obstructed. A driver's view is deemed to be obstructed when at 8 any time during the last two hundred feet [60.96 meters] of the driver's approach 9 to such crossing, the driver does not have a clear and uninterrupted view of such 10 railway crossing and of any traffic on such railway for a distance of four hundred 11 feet [121.92 meters] in each direction from such crossing.
- b. Twenty miles [32.19 kilometers] an hour when passing a school during school
 recess or while children are going to or leaving school during opening or closing
 hours, unless a lower speed is designated or posted by local authorities.
- c. Twenty miles [32.19 kilometers] an hour when approaching within fifty feet [15.24
 meters] and in traversing an intersection of highways when the driver's view is
 obstructed. A driver's view is deemed to be obstructed when at any time during
 the last fifty feet [15.24 meters] of the driver's approach to such intersection, the
 driver does not have a clear and uninterrupted view of such intersection and of
 the traffic upon all of the highways entering such intersection for a distance of two
 hundred feet [60.96 meters] from such intersection.
- d. Twenty miles [32.19 kilometers] an hour when the driver's view of the highway
 ahead is obstructed within a distance of one hundred feet [30.48 meters].
- e. Twenty-five miles [40.23 kilometers] an hour on any highway in a business district
 or in a residence district or in a public park, unless a different speed is designated
 and posted by local authorities.
- f. Fifty-five miles [88.51 kilometers] an hour on gravel, dirt, or loose surface
 highways, and on paved two-lane county and township highways if there is no
 speed limit posted, unless otherwise permitted, restricted, or required by
 conditions.

Section 39-09-07.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows: 10 39-09-07.1. Speed zones - Reduction limitation. 11 Except for highway construction zones under subsections 2 and 3, no a street, road, or 1. 12 highway in the state highway system or any other township, county, or state road or 13 highway may not be posted in a manner which reduces the maximum speed limit on 14 the street, road, or highway by more than twenty miles [32.19 kilometers] per hour 15 between any two signs so posted in a speed zone. 16 <u>2.</u> The maximum speed limit reductions between two fixed or variable signs in a variable 17 speed limit adjustment zone may exceed twenty miles [32.18 kilometers] per hour 18 when speed limits are lowered temporarily by the director due to unsafe conditions. 19 3. The maximum speed limit reduction between any two signs posted in a highway 20 construction zone may not exceed thirty miles [48.28 kilometers] per hour. 21 **SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 2 of section 40-05-06 of the North Dakota Century 22 Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 23 For every violation of a city ordinance that regulates the operation or equipment of a 2. 24 motor vehicle or which regulates traffic, except those ordinances listed in section 25 39-06.1-05, a fee may be established, by ordinance, which may exceed, by up to one 26 hundred percent, the limit, for an equivalent category of violation, set forth in section 27 39-06.1-06 except for a violation of a speed limitation.
