PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO FIRST ENGROSSMENT

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2330

In place of amendment (25.0551.06001) adopted by the House, Engrossed Senate Bill No. 2330 is amended by amendment (25.0551.06003) as follows:

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-09 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to human trafficking and exploitation prevention and awareness
- 3 education for students at public schools and tribal schools; and to provide an appropriation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 6 and enacted as follows:

Human trafficking and exploitation prevention and awareness education.

- 1. The board of a school district and the governing board of a school operated by a tribal government shall:
 - Adopt a policy regarding human trafficking and exploitation prevention and awareness education for students and faculty. As used in this section, "human trafficking" includes sex trafficking.
 - <u>Bequire schoolwide education addressing human trafficking and exploitation</u>
 <u>prevention and awareness for all students in grades four throughsix, ten, and twelve.</u>
 - c. Offer to parents and legal guardians optional workshops or materials or both to support the education of the child of the parent or legal guardian on personal safety and grooming prevention.
- 2. The education under this section:

25	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION -				
26	HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND EXPLOITATION PREVENTION AND AWARENESS				
27	EDUCATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury,				
28	not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$48,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to				
29	the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of implementing human trafficking and				
30	exploitation prevention and awareness education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and				
31	ending June 30, 2027.
