- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-06 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to policies for student cellular telephone use.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
5 and enacted as follows:

6 Cellular telephone usage policy.

7 <u>1.</u>	As used in this section:
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- 8 a. <u>"Cellular telephone" means a wireless communication device, which is capable of</u>
 9 transmitting voice, text, or data between parties. The term does not include a
 10 tablet, laptop computer, or personal computer approved by the school district for
 11 educational use.
- b. "Instructional time" means the time when a student is attending class or an
 educational activity.
- 14c."Noninstructional time" means the time when a student is not attending class or15an educational activity, including lunch, recess, time between classes, the time16before a student's first class and after a student's last class, and open class17periods.
- 18 <u>2.</u> <u>A board of a school district shall adopt a policy governing the use of cellular</u>
- 19 <u>telephones during instructional and noninstructional time.</u>
- 20 <u>3.</u> <u>A policy:</u>
- 21a.May include time and location restrictions for cellular telephone usage, limitations22regarding disruptions, proper instructional use, acceptable and unacceptable use

1		<u>of c</u>	ellular telephones for students and staff, and disciplinary actions for student	
2		nor	noncompliance.	
3	<u>b.</u>	Mu	Must include exceptions for:	
4		<u>(1)</u>	Medical accommodations. An individual may use a cellular telephone or	
5			other technological device, if required for accommodations based on a	
6			disability or management of a medical condition, including continuous	
7			glucose monitoring or seizure alerts. The individual shall provide to the	
8			school administrator relevant documentation from a licensed health care	
9			provider.	
10		<u>(2)</u>	Educational accommodations. A student with an individual education	
11			program, individual learning plan, a plan under section 504 of the	
12			Rehabilitation Act of 1973 [29 U.S.C. 794], or other plan under the law must	
13			be accommodated according to the plan.	
14		<u>(3)</u>	Emergency situations affecting the health, safety, or well-being of a student	
15			<u>or staff member.</u>
