- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-01 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to review of public school compliance with state law.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 5 and enacted as follows:
- 6 Public schools Compliance review Determination by attorney general.
- 7 <u>1. An interested person may submit to the state board of public school education a</u>
  8 request for review to determine whether a school district is in compliance with an
- 9 education-related state statute.

   2. A request for review must be submitted in the manner prescribed by the state board of public school education. The state board of public school education shall develop a
- form for an interested person to initiate the review process.
- 13 3. A school district shall provide to the public on the school district website the form
- 14 under subsection 2 and instructions to submit the request for review.
- 15 <u>4.</u> <u>The attorney general shall:</u>
- 16 <u>a. Review the information submitted by the interested person, investigate as</u>
- 17 <u>necessary, and determine whether a school district is in compliance with an</u>
- 18 education-related state statute; or
- b. <u>Dismiss a request for review if the request for review exceeds the purpose of this</u>
- 20 section or fails to meet the requirements of the state board of public school
- 21 education.

## Sixty-ninth Legislative Assembly

- If the attorney general finds the school district is failing to comply with an education related state statute, the attorney general shall advise the school district of the findings
   and provide instructions on how to comply with the statute.
- 4 6. The attorney general's findings are prima facie evidence in an adjudicative proceeding under chapter 28-32.
- 7. The state board of public school education, with the attorney general, may adopt rules
   to implement this section.
