- A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 3 of section 19-24.1-01, section 19-24.1-11,
- 2 and subdivision a of subsection 2 of section 19-24.1-16 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 3 relating to medical marijuana limitations.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 19-24.1-01 of the North Dakota
 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - "Allowable amount of usable marijuana" means the amount of usable marijuana a registered qualifying patient or registered designated caregiver may purchase in a thirty-day period under this chapter.
 - a. Except as provided under subdivision b:
 - (1) During a thirty-day period, a registered qualifying patient may not purchase or have purchased by a registered designated caregiver more than two and one-half ounces [70.87 grams]three ounces [85.05 grams] of dried leaves or flowers of the plant of the genus cannabis in a combustible delivery form.
 - (2) At any time a registered qualifying patient, or a registered designated caregiver on behalf of a registered qualifying patient, may not possess more than three ounces [85.05 grams] four and one-half ounces [127.57 grams] of dried leaves or flowers of the plant of the genus cannabis in a combustible delivery form.
 - b. Notwithstanding subdivision a, if a registered qualifying patient has a registry identification card authorizing an enhanced allowable amount:
 - (1) During a thirty-day period a registered qualifying patient may not purchase or have purchased by a registered designated caregiver more than six-

3	(2)	At any time a registered qualifying patient, or a registered designated

6		ounces [318.93 grams] of dried leaves or flowers of the plant of the genus
7		cannabis in a combustible delivery form.
8	c. Are	egistered qualifying patient may not purchase or have purchased by a
9	reg	istered designated caregiver more than the maximum concentration or
10	am	ount of tetrahydrocannabinol permitted in a thirty-day period. The maximum
11	con	ncentration or amount of tetrahydrocannabinol permitted in a thirty-day period
12	for	a cannabinoid concentrate or medical cannabinoid product, or the cumulative
13	tota	al of both, is six thousand <u>nine thousand</u> milligrams.
14	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 19-24.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
15	amended and reenacted as follows:

26	e. The	e date of issuance and expiration date;
27	f. A ra	andom ten-digit alphanumeric identification number containing at least four
28	nur	mbers and at least four letters which is unique to the cardholder;
29	g. If th	ne cardholder is a designated caregiver, the random identification number of
30	the	qualifying patient the designated caregiver is authorized to assist;
31	h. Ap	hotograph of the cardholder; and

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- 1 The phone number or website address at which the card can be verified. 2 2. Except as otherwise provided in this section or rule adopted under this chapter, a 3 registry identification card expiration date must be one yeartwo years after the date of 4 issuance. 5 If a health care provider limits the written certification until a specified date, less than 6 one yeartwo years, the registry identification card expires on that date. 7 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subdivision a of subsection 2 of section 19-24.1-16 of the 8 North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 9
 - a. The compassion center submits a renewal fee, in an amount not to exceed ninety—thousandeighty-one thousand dollars for a dispensary and one hundred ten thousand dollars for a manufacturing facility, which the department shall refund if the department rejects the renewal application;
