- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide appropriations to the attorney general, the department of career and
- 2 technical education, the department of health and human services, the agriculture
- 3 commissioner, and the department of transportation for autonomous technology grants; to
- 4 provide for a legislative management study; and to provide a report.

# 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

# 6 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - ATTORNEY GENERAL - AUTONOMOUS

# 7 TECHNOLOGY GRANTS - ONE-TIME FUNDING - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE

### 8 MANAGEMENT.

- 9 1. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not 10 otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$750,000, or so much of the sum as may be 11 necessary, to the attorney general for the purpose of providing autonomous 12 technology grants to individuals or entities that aid the bureau of criminal investigation 13 in conducting missing person searches, crime scene reconstruction, and law 14 enforcement first response operations, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and 15 ending June 30, 2027. The funding provided in this section is considered a one-time 16 funding item.
- For purposes of this section, autonomous technology includes uncrewed aircraft
   systems; autonomous vehicles; or other autonomous systems, processes, or
   technologies.
- The attorney general shall develop an application process and guidelines for the
   grants, including eligibility criteria, matching requirements, eligible uses of grant
   funding, and maximum grant awards. To be eligible for a grant, an individual or entity
   shall certify to the attorney general that the operation of the autonomous technology is

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1		related to conducting missing person searches, crime scene reconstruction, and law
2		enforcement first response operations. The attorney general may require an individual
3		or entity to provide one dollar of matching funds for every four dollars awarded by the
4		state. An individual or entity may use grant funding for autonomous technology
5		operations, contracting for services related to autonomous technology, or other eligible
6		uses as determined by the attorney general.
7	4.	During the 2025-26 interim, the attorney general shall provide at least one report to the
8		legislative management regarding the grants, including a list of grant recipients, the
9		amounts awarded, and a description of the use of the grant funding.
10	SEC	TION 2. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF CAREER AND TECHNICAL
11	EDUCA	TION - AUTONOMOUS TECHNOLOGY GRANTS - ONE-TIME FUNDING - REPORT
12	TO LEG	SISLATIVE MANAGEMENT.
13	1.	There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not
14		otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$750,000, or so much of the sum as may be
15		necessary, to the department of career and technical education for the purpose of
16		providing autonomous technology grants to a workforce training center serving the
17		northwest area of the state for providing workforce training to address workforce
18		shortages in the state, including shortages in the oil and gas industry, and for the
19		development of a drone racing course, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and
20		ending June 30, 2027. The funding provided in this section is considered a one-time
21		funding item.
22	2.	For purposes of this section, autonomous technology includes uncrewed aircraft
23		systems; autonomous vehicles; or other autonomous systems, processes, or
24		technologies.
25	3.	The department of career and technical education shall develop an application
26		process and guidelines for the grants, including eligibility criteria, matching
27		requirements, eligible uses of grant funding, and maximum grant awards. To be
28		eligible for a grant, a workforce training center shall certify to the department of career
29		and technical education that the operation of the autonomous technology is related to
30		workforce training to address workforce shortages in the state, including shortages in
31		the oil and gas industry, and the development of a drone racing course. The

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1	department of career and technical education may require a workforce training center
2	to provide one dollar of matching funds for every four dollars awarded by the state. A
3	workforce training center may use grant funding for education or training curriculum
4	expenses related to autonomous technology, autonomous technology operations,
5	contracting for services related to autonomous technology, or other eligible uses as
6	determined by the department of career and technical education.

- During the 2025-26 interim, the department of career and technical education shall
  provide at least one report to the legislative management regarding the grants,
  including a list of grant recipients, the amounts awarded, and a description of the use
  of the grant funding.

# 13 LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT.

- There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not
   otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$750,000, or so much of the sum as may be
   necessary, to the department of health and human services for the purpose of
   providing autonomous technology grants to individuals or entities that aid the functions
   and operations of rural emergency response and disaster mitigation, for the biennium
   beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. The funding provided in this
   section is considered a one-time funding item.
- For purposes of this section, autonomous technology includes uncrewed aircraft
   systems; autonomous vehicles; or other autonomous systems, processes, or
   technologies.
- 24 3. The department of health and human services shall develop an application process 25 and guidelines for the grants, including eligibility criteria, matching requirements, 26 eligible uses of grant funding, and maximum grant awards. To be eligible for a grant, 27 an individual or entity shall certify to the department of health and human services that 28 the operation of the autonomous technology is related to aiding the functions and 29 operations of rural emergency response and disaster mitigation. The department of 30 health and human services may require an individual or entity to provide one dollar of 31 matching funds for every four dollars awarded by the state. An individual or entity may

1		use grant funding for autonomous technology operations, contracting for services
2		related to autonomous technology, or other eligible uses as determined by the
3		department of health and human services.
4	4.	During the 2025-26 interim, the department of health and human services shall
5		provide at least one report to the legislative management regarding the grants,
6		including a list of grant recipients, the amounts awarded, and a description of the use
7		of the grant funding.
8	SEC	TION 4. APPROPRIATION - AGRICULTURE COMMISSIONER - AUTONOMOUS
9	TECHN	OLOGY GRANTS - ONE-TIME FUNDING - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE
10	MANAG	GEMENT.
11	1.	There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not
12		otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$750,000, or so much of the sum as may be
13		necessary, to the agriculture commissioner for the purpose of providing autonomous
14		technology grants to individuals or entities in the agriculture industry, for the biennium
15		beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. The funding provided in this
16		section is considered a one-time funding item.
17	2.	For purposes of this section, autonomous technology includes uncrewed aircraft
18		systems; autonomous vehicles; or other autonomous systems, processes, or
19		technologies.
20	3.	The agriculture commissioner shall develop an application process and guidelines for
21		the grants, including eligibility criteria, matching requirements, eligible uses of grant
22		funding, and maximum grant awards. To be eligible for a grant, an individual or entity
23		shall certify to the agriculture commissioner that the operation of the autonomous
24		technology is related to the inspection, operation, maintenance, or construction of
25		agriculture property or infrastructure. The agriculture commissioner may require an
26		individual or entity to provide one dollar of matching funds for every four dollars
27		awarded by the state. An individual or entity may use grant funding for autonomous
28		technology operations, contracting for services related to autonomous technology, or
29		other eligible uses as determined by the agriculture commissioner.

- 1 During the 2025-26 interim, the agriculture commissioner shall provide at least one 2 report to the legislative management regarding the grants, including a list of grant 3 recipients, the amounts awarded, and a description of the use of the grant funding. 4 **SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION -**5 AUTONOMOUS TECHNOLOGY GRANTS - ONE-TIME FUNDING - REPORT TO 6 LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT. 7 There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not 1. 8 otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$750,000, or so much of the sum as may be 9 necessary, to the department of transportation for the purpose of providing 10 autonomous technology grants to individuals or entities that monitor the United States 11 highway 2 corridor within the state to assist local and state law enforcement agencies, 12 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027. The funding 13 provided in this section is considered a one-time funding item. 14 2. For purposes of this section, autonomous technology includes uncrewed aircraft 15 systems; autonomous vehicles; or other autonomous systems, processes, or
- 16 technologies.
- 17 3. The department of transportation shall develop an application process and guidelines 18 for the grants, including eligibility criteria, matching requirements, eligible uses of grant 19 funding, and maximum grant awards. To be eligible for a grant, an individual or entity 20 shall certify to the department of transportation that the operation of the autonomous 21 technology is related to monitoring the United States highway 2 corridor within the 22 state to assist local and state law enforcement agencies. The department of 23 transportation may require an individual or entity to provide one dollar of matching 24 funds for every four dollars awarded by the state. An individual or entity may use grant 25 funding for autonomous technology operations, contracting for services related to 26 autonomous technology, or other eligible uses as determined by the department of 27 transportation.
- During the 2025-26 interim, the department of transportation shall provide at least one
   report to the legislative management regarding the grants, including a list of grant
   recipients, the amounts awarded, and a description of the use of the grant funding.

## 1 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - AUTONOMOUS TECHNOLOGY.

- 2 During the 2025-26 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the costs and
- 3 benefits of investing in autonomous technology infrastructure in the state. The study must
- 4 include an analysis of the industries using autonomous technology, future industries that may
- 5 use autonomous technology, the economic impact of autonomous technology, and the return on
- 6 investment to the state. The legislative management shall report its findings and
- 7 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
- 8 the seventieth legislative assembly.
