- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 54-03.1-02 and 54-03.1-03 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to the organizational session of the legislative assembly.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 54-03.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

## 6 54-03.1-02. Time and place of meeting - Who must attend.

- 7 In each even-numbered year on the first Monday in the month of December or on a 1. 8 date selected by the legislative management but not earlier than December first nor 9 later than December fifteenth, all personsindividuals elected at the previous November 10 general election as members of the succeeding legislative session, and members 11 whose terms do not expire until the first day of December following the next November 12 general election, shall meet in the state capitol in the city of Bismarck, or at such other 13 place as may be designated, at a time designated by the legislative management for 14 the purpose of conducting an organizational session.
- 15 <u>2.</u> The legislative management shall call the organizational session and the legislative
  16 council shall make such arrangements as may be necessary for operation of the
  17 session.
- 18 <u>3.</u> The organizational session may be conducted over a period of up to five business
   19 <u>days.</u>
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 54-03.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
   amended and reenacted as follows:

2	The	agenda of the organizational session must include the following:
3	1.	Orientation classes upon legislative rules and procedure for new legislators; regarding:
4		a. Floor session and standing committee procedures, including adopted legislative
5		rules and common practices;
6		b. <u>Appropriations committees procedures;</u>
7		c. Use of tools, equipment, and technology relating to the legislative process; and
8		d. Constitutional law, statutes of limitations, due process, and other general legal
9		principles as arranged by legislative council;
10	2.	Presentation of reports by legislative interim committees or commissions;
11	3.	Party caucuses to review proposed legislative rules and committee assignments, as
12		appropriate;
13	4.	Appointment of procedural committees;
14	5.	Presentation of the budget and revenue proposals recommended by the governor as
15		provided in section 54-44.1-07; and
16		b. A report, as directed by legislative management, presented by each constitutional
17		officeholder; and
18	6.	All other similar matters <del>, in order that so</del> the legislative assembly beis fully organized
19		and ready to begin its business by the first day of the regular session.
