## **ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1442**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-35 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the creation of a legislative task force on government efficiency; to
- 3 provide an expiration date; and to declare an emergency.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-35 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 7 <u>Legislative task force on government efficiency Members Duties Report to the</u>
- 8 legislative management.

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- 1. The legislative management shall create a legislative task force on government
   efficiency.
- 11 2. Each member of the task force shall serve two-year terms. The membership of the
   12 task force consists of:
- 13 a. The chief information officer;
- 14 <u>b.</u> The director of the office of management and budget;
  - c. The chief operating officer for the office of the governor;
- d. One elected statewide officer, appointed by the governor;
- 17 <u>e. One member of the legislative assembly, appointed by the governor;</u>
- 18 <u>f. Two members of the house of representatives, appointed by the majority leader</u>
  19 of the house of representatives; and
- 20 g. Two members of the senate, appointed by the majority leader of the senate.
- 21 3. The member of the legislative assembly appointed by the governor shall serve as
   22 chairman of the task force.

1	<u>4.</u>	The task force shall:	
2		<u>a.</u>	Meet at least once each calendar quarter or more frequently at the call of the
3			chairman.
4		<u>b.</u>	Review and analyze budgets and reports from executive branch agencies,
5			boards and commissions, and the supreme court.
6		<u>C.</u>	Collaborate with and receive testimony from executive branch agencies, boards
7			and commissions, and the supreme court to identify areas to increase efficiency,
8			methods to implement cost-saving measures, determine areas of state
9			government deemed unnecessary or duplicative, target outdated or overly
10			restrictive regulations, and find areas in which partnerships between the state
11			and private industry would create innovative financing models to drive economic
12			growth and job creation.
13		<u>d.</u>	Review the effectiveness and necessity of programs and laws created by the
14			legislative assembly through previous legislative enactments.
15		<u>e.</u>	Request the state auditor or an independent private auditing firm to conduct
16			program evaluations using generally accepted performance audit standards for
17			state and local governments.
18		<u>f.</u>	Submit an annual report to the legislative management detailing its findings and
19			progress in implementing cost-saving measures and efficiencies along with any
20			recommended legislation for introduction at the next legislative session.
21	<u>5.</u>	A st	tate employee who is a member of the task force is entitled to receive that
22		<u>em</u>	ployee's regular salary and is entitled to reimbursement for mileage and expenses
23		to b	be paid by the employing agency. A member of the task force who is a member of
24		the	legislative assembly is entitled to receive per diem compensation at the rate
25		pro	vided under section 54-35-10 for each day performing official duties of the task
26		forc	ce. The legislative council shall pay the per diem compensation and reimbursement
27		for 1	travel and expenses as provided by law for any member of the task force who is a
28		<u>mei</u>	mber of the legislative assembly.
29	<u>6.</u>	<u>The</u>	e legislative council shall provide staffing and administrative services for the task
30		forc	ce through July 31, 2031.

- 1 **SECTION 2. EXPIRATION DATE.** This Act is effective through July 31, 2031, and after that
- 2 date is ineffective.
- 3 **SECTION 3. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
