- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 43-13-01, 43-13-02, 43-13-05, 43-13-07,
- 2 43-13-08, 43-13-13, 43-13-13.2, 43-13-13.3, 43-13-15, 43-13-16, 43-13-17, and 43-13-19 of the
- 3 North Dakota Century Code, relating to optometrist licensure.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-13-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 **43-13-01**. Definitions.

- 8 In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:
- 9 1. "Board" means the North Dakota state board of optometry.
- "Diagnosis and treatment" means the determination, interpretation, and treatment of
 any visual, muscular, neurological, or anatomical anomaly of the eye which may be
 aided, relieved, or corrected through visual training procedures or through the use of
- 13 lenses, prisms, filters, ophthalmic instruments, pharmaceutical agents, or
- 14 combinations thereof, held either in contact with the eye, or in frames or mountings, as
- further authorized by this chapter. Laser therapy and the use of invasive surgery are
 not permitted under this chapter, except superficial foreign bodies may be removed
- 17 and primary care procedures may be performed.
- "Optometry" means a primary health care profession whose practitioners are engaged
 in the evaluation of disorders of the human eye and the examination, diagnosis, and
- 20 treatment thereof, together with its appendagesDistant site provider" means a provider
- 21 of optometric services through telemedicine from a site other than the patient's
- 22 <u>origination site. A distant site provider must hold an active license to practice</u>
- 23 <u>optometry in this state</u>.

1	4.	<u>"Op</u>	tometric services" means any evaluation, examination, diagnosis, or treatment		
2		pro∖	vided for a patient within the scope of practice of optometry. The term includes the		
3		pres	scription of pharmaceutical agents by a provider to a patient.		
4	<u>5.</u>	"Pharmaceutical agent" means diagnostic pharmaceutical agents or therapeutic			
5		pha	rmaceutical agents. The term includes nonscheduled pharmaceutical agents,		
6		exce	ept for acetaminophen with thirty milligrams of codeine, that have documented use		
7		in th	ne treatment of ocular-related disorders or diseases. As used in this subsection:		
8		a.	"Diagnostic pharmaceutical agents" means pharmaceutical agents administered		
9			for the evaluation and diagnosis of disorders of the human eye including		
10			anesthetics, mydriatics, myotics, cycloplegics, diagnostic dyes, diagnostic stains,		
11			and pharmaceutical agents to evaluate abnormal pupil responses.		
12		b.	"Therapeutic pharmaceutical agents" includes topically administered and		
13			prescribed pharmaceutical agents for treatment of ocular-related disorders or		
14			disease, locally administered pharmaceutical agents for primary eye care		
15			procedures, oral anti-infective agents, oral antihistaminic agents, and oral		
16			analgesics for the treatment of ocular-related disorders or diseases.		
17	5.	"Pre	acticing optometry" means:		
18		a.	Displaying a sign or in any way advertising as an optometrist.		
19		b.	Employing any means for the measurement of the powers of vision or the		
20			adaptation of lenses for the aid thereof.		
21		C.	Engaging in any manner in the practice of optometry

31		except surgery.

- 13 1. To enforce the provisions and carry out the purposes of this chapter.
- 14 2. To make and enforce such rules and regulations consistent with law as may be
- 15 necessary for the proper performance of its duties; the effective enforcement of this
- 16 chapter; the reasonable regulation of the profession of optometry and the practice
- thereof by persons licensed under this chapter; and to protect the health, welfare, andsafety of the citizens of this state.
- To proceed in the courts of this state by injunction when considered necessary to
 restrain any violation of this chapter.

- 30 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-13-13.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is

3	1.	Any person engaged in visual training procedures or who employs or prescribes				
4		lenses, prisms, filters, ophthalmic instruments, or combinations thereof, held either in				
5		contact with the eye, or in frames or mounting, to aid, relieve, or correct any visual or				
6		ocular anomaly, or holds out as being able to do so, is deemed to be engaged in the				
7		practice of optometry.				
8	2.	Before any optometrist may prescribe and administer pharmaceutical agents in the				
9	_ .	treatment and management of ocular diseases, the optometrist must first be certified				
10		or qualify for certification in the use of diagnostic pharmaceutical agents. For additional-				
11		certification to prescribe and administer pharmaceutical agents in the treatment and				
12		management of ocular disease, the board shall require at least seventy-six hours of				
13						
		didactic instruction and twenty-four hours of clinical application of pharmaceutical				
14		agents for the treatment and management of ocular diseases. The course for				
15		therapeutic certification must be provided by an institution accredited by a regional or				
16		professional accrediting organization that is recognized and approved by the United				
17		States department of education or the council on postsecondary accreditation.				
18	3.	An optometrist may not dispense therapeutic pharmaceutical agents, except an				
19		optometrist may:				
20		a. Provide a patient a drug sample at no cost to the patient; or				
21		b. Sell contact lenses or ophthalmic devices that are classified by the federal food				
22		and drug administration as a drug.				
23	<u>4.3.</u>	The board shall provide the board of pharmacy upon request a list of licensed				
24		optometrists certified in the use of pharmaceutical agents. An optometric telemedicine				
25		provider-patient relationship is established when a patient seeks optometric services				
26		from a provider, and the provider agrees to provide optometric services to the patient,				
27		except in an emergency. The provider-patient relationship may be expressly created or				
28		created through implication; however, the provider-patient relationship is not created				
29		through receipt of patient health information by the provider unless a prior provider-				
30		patient relationship exists. The initial patient relationship must be established through				

1		an eye examination conducted by a licensed optometrist with a physical location in			
2		state.			
3	<u>4.</u>	A licensed optometrist may use telemedicine to provide care in accordance with			
4		standards of practice established by the board. Telemedicine services may include			
5		consultation, diagnosis, and treatment for ocular diseases, provided that the			
6		optometrist complies with the regulations under this section. Before providing any			
7		optometric services to a patient via telemedicine, the provider first shall provide			
8		appropriate verification of the provider's identification, licensure, and current contact			
9		information.			
10	<u>5.</u>	Informed consent regarding the optometric services to be provided via telemedicine			
11		must include, at a minimum, information regarding the provider's technology used to			
12		provide optometric services via telemedicine and how to mitigate or resolve any			
13		technological disconnection or issue.			
14	SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 43-13-13.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
15	amended and reenacted as follows:				
16	43-1	3-13.3. Standard of care - When consultation with physician required.			
17	1. A	An optometrist certified by the board in the use of pharmaceutical agents as provided in			
18	this chapter must be held to the same standard of care in the use of such agents as are				
19	physicia	ns licensed by the North Dakota board of medicine.			
20	2.	Any optometrist authorized by the board to use pharmaceutical agents shall consult			
21		with a physician duly licensed to practice medicine when any diseased or pathological			
22		conditions of the eye do not respond to treatment. The consultation must be			
23		documented in the patient's record.

5		disp	ense, fit , or prescribe to the public contact lenses, or any medical appliance

30	Every applicant for a license to practice optometry in this state who meets the standards					
31	required for licensure, including successfully passing the required examination, must be
