- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 43 and a new section to chapter
- 2 54-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the duties of occupational and professional

3 boards and the receipt by the office of the governor of complaints following licensing decisions

4 of occupational and professional boards; and to provide for a report.

5 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

6 **SECTION 1.** A new chapter to title 43 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 7 enacted as follows:

- 8 Definitions. 9 As used in this chapter: 10 "Board" means a board, commission, or other agency of state government created or 1. 11 identified in this title to regulate an occupation or profession. 12 <u>2.</u> "Occupation or profession" means activity for which a license is required from a board 13 or similar activity for which a foreign license is required in another state or jurisdiction. 14 Boards - Duties - Licensing complaints - Report. 15 A board shall adopt rules to implement this chapter. 1. 16 2. A board shall submit a report to the governor annually and in a manner specified by 17 the governor. Each report must include the following information for the previous 18 calendar year: A summary of board activity; 19 <u>a.</u> 20 b. The number of: 21 (1) Licensees issued; 22 (2) License applicants, including the number of;
 - (a) <u>Total applicants;</u>

24 (b) In-state and out-of-state applicants; and

1	(c) New and renewing applicants; and
2	(3) Former licensees who failed to renew.
3	3. A board shall provide instructions on the board's website detailing how to submit a
4	complaint following an adverse decision of the board or one of its members in matters
5	relating to licensing.
6	SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 54-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
7	and enacted as follows:
8	Occupational and professional boards - Licensing complaints.
9	The governor shall develop a procedure through which an individual may submit a
10	complaint to the office of the governor following an adverse decision of a board or one of its
11	members relating to a licensing matter for an occupation or profession. The governor shall
12	establish a procedure to investigate a complaint filed under this section.
