- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-40.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the funding of regional planning councils; and to provide an
- 3 appropriation.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-40.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created			
6	and enacted as follows:			
7	<u>Biennial work plan - Funding</u> .			
8	<u>1. A regional council shall prepare a biennial work plan. The work plan must:</u>			

- 9 <u>a.</u> Include proposed actions, targeted outcomes, and an itemized budget.
- 10b.Align with the comprehensive economic development strategy for the region11developed with input from regional stakeholders, including members of the12legislative assembly.
- 13 <u>c.</u> <u>Be approved by the regional council's executive board before submission.</u>
- 14 <u>d.</u> <u>Address issues of rural capacity, including business development, zoning and</u>
- 15 <u>land use planning, grant writing and technical assistance, housing development,</u>
- 16 <u>child care support, workforce development, infrastructure planning, tourism and</u>
- 17 placemaking initiatives, disaster recovery planning, and community leadership
- 18 <u>development.</u>
- 19 <u>2.</u> <u>A regional council shall submit:</u>

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1		<u>a.</u>	Copies of the biennial work plan no later than twelve months before the	
2			beginning of each biennium to the commissioner of the department of commerce,	
3			the governor, and members of the legislative assembly representing the region. A	
4			county providing financial support to regional councils shall maintain or exceed	
5			the funding to ensure the continuation of regional development efforts.	
6		<u>b.</u>	Reporting metrics detailing program outcomes, expenditures, and other relevant	
7			performance measures no later than forty-five days before the end of the	
8			biennium to the commissioner of the department of commerce, the governor, and	
9			members of the legislative assembly representing the region.	
10	<u>3.</u>	<u>Sub</u>	ject to legislative appropriations, the department of commerce shall provide	
11		<u>func</u>	ling to regional councils to implement the biennial work plan.	
12	<u>4.</u>	<u>Fun</u>	<u>ds may:</u>	
13		<u>a.</u>	Be used to employ individuals or for contractual services to implement the	
14			biennial work plan under this section.	
15		<u>b.</u>	Not be used for debt repayment, loans, grants, lobbying, political activities, or	
16			unrelated or nonessential expenses, including entertainment, luxury purchases,	
17			or projects that do not demonstrate a regional benefit.	
18	<u>5.</u>	<u>Fifty</u>	percent of appropriated funding must be allocated equally among the eight	
19		<u>regi</u>	ons and fifty percent must be awarded based on a funding formula established	
20		joint	tly by the department of commerce and the association of regional councils.	
21	<u>6.</u>	The	funding formula under subsection 5 must be reviewed and amended as necessary	
22		eve	ry four years and provide equitable allocation of funding for a regional council	
23		<u>prov</u>	viding services for multiple service areas or counties.	
24	<u> </u>	- <u>The</u>	department of commerce shall provide to each regional council a minimum	
25		allo	cation of five hundred thousand dollars per region per biennium and a maximum	
26		<del>allo</del>	cation of one million five hundred thousand dollars per region per biennium.	
27	SEC		N 2. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE - REGIONAL	
28	<b>COUNCILS.</b> There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury,			
29	not otherwise appropriated, the sum of <u>\$8,000,000</u> <u>\$1,000,000</u> , or so much of the sum as may			
30	be necessary, to the department of commerce for the purpose of funding regional planning			
31	councils, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027.
