## **SENATE BILL NO. 2176**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-07 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the children's cabinet and designated working groups; to repeal
- 3 section 50-06-43.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the children's cabinet; to
- 4 provide for a legislative management report; and to provide an appropriation.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 8 Children's cabinet Membership Duties Working groups Report.
- 1. The children's cabinet is created to assess, guide, and coordinate the care for children
  and families across the state's branches of government and the tribal nations.
- 11 <u>2. The children's cabinet is composed of:</u>
  - <u>a.</u> The governor, or the governor's designee;
  - b. The chief justice of the supreme court, or the chief justice's designee;
    - c. A member Two members of the house of representatives from an even-numbered legislative district and a member of the house of representatives from an odd-numbered legislative district, appointed by the majority leader of the house of representatives to serve two-year terms;
    - d. A member Two members of the senate from an even-numbered legislative district and a member of the senate from an odd-numbered legislative district, appointed by the majority leader of the senate to serve two-year terms;

1		<u>e.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction, or the superintendent's designee;
2		<u>f.</u>	The director of the committee on protection and advocacy, or the director's
3			designee;
4		<u>g.</u>	The commissioner of the department of health and human services, or the
5			commissioner's designee;
6		<u>h.</u>	A representative of the tribal nations in the state, who is appointed by the
7			governor; and
8		<u>i.</u>	FourFive individuals representing parents, private service providers, or other
9			community interests, who are, appointed by the governor to serve a term of two
10			years, at the pleasure of the governor, and who are entitled to reimbursement
11			from the governor's office for travel and lodging at the same rate as provided for
12			state officers and employeesconsisting of:
13			(1) A local school representative;
14			(2) A local special education representative;
15			(3) A human service zone director;
16			(4) A representative of a private agency that provides direct services to
17			vulnerable children; and
18			(5) A parent.
19	<u>3.</u>	The	governor, in collaboration with the chairman of the legislative management, shall
20		<u>app</u>	oint as the presiding officer of the children's cabinet a member of the governor's
21		<u>cab</u>	inet or a legislator serving on the children's cabinet. The children's cabinet shall
22		<u>sele</u>	ect one of its members to serve as the vice-presiding officer.
23	<u>4.</u>	The	children's cabinet shall meet at least quarterly. Additional meetings may be held at
24		the	discretion of the presiding officer.
25	<u>5.</u>	The	children's cabinet shall:
26		<u>a.</u>	Coordinate broad-based leadership across programs, agencies, branches of
27			government, and tribal nations to meet the needs of children and families;
28		<u>b.</u>	Develop strategies to address gaps or needs regarding early care and education,
29			medical and behavioral health, community, child welfare, and juvenile justice;

1		<u>C.</u>	Develop strategies to provide for the full continuum of care in the delivery of
2			services, including promotion, prevention, early identification and intervention,
3			service delivery, and recovery;
4		<u>d.</u>	Seek to engage cooperation across public and private service providers;
5		<u>e.</u>	Provide a comprehensive vision for how and where children are best served,
6			attending to children and families in a respectful and relevant manner;
7		<u>f.</u>	Seek strategies to provide services to children without consideration of prior
8			engagement with juvenile services;
9		<u>g.</u>	Provide for the active participation of consumers and providers statewide on
10			advisory committees;
11		<u>h.</u>	Receive information and recommendations from the department of health and
12			human services, department of corrections and rehabilitation, and other state
13			agencies;
14		<u>i.</u>	Establish and oversee designated working groups to develop policies impacting
15			children and families; and
16		<u>j.</u>	Provide an annual report to the legislative management and governor regarding
17			the activities and findings of:
18			(1) The children's cabinet; and
19			(2) Other designated working groups on children and family issues.
20	<u>6.</u>	<u>The</u>	office of the governor shall provide staffing and administrative services for the
21		<u>child</u>	Iren's cabinet and coordinate with other designated working groups on children
22		<u>and</u>	family issues.
23	<u>7.</u>	<u>a.</u>	The presiding officer of the children's cabinet may designate working groups and
24			appoint or remove liaisons to serve on the working groups.
25		<u>b.</u>	A member of the children's cabinet or working group who is not a state employee
26			is entitled to reimbursement for mileage and expenses as provided by law for
27			state officers and employees, to be paid by the office of the governor.
28		<u>C.</u>	A state employee who is a member of the children's cabinet or working group is
29			entitled to receive that employee's regular salary and is entitled to reimbursement
RN.			for mileage and expenses to be paid by the employing agency

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1	<u>d.</u>	A member of the children's cabinet or working group who is a member of the
2		legislative assembly is entitled to receive per diem compensation at the rate
3		provided under section 54-35-10 for each day performing official duties of the
4		children's cabinet or working group. The legislative council shall pay the per diem
5		compensation and reimbursement for travel and such expenses as provided by
6		law for any member of the children's cabinet or working group who is a member
7		of the legislative assembly.
8	SECTION	<b>2. REPEAL.</b> Section 50-06-43.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
9	SECTION	N 3. APPROPRIATION - OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR - CHILDREN'S CABINET.
10	There is appr	opriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise
11	appropriated,	the sum of \$220,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the office of
12	the governor,	for the purpose of administering the children's cabinet and coordinating
13	designated w	orking groups, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027.
