- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-07 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the children's cabinet and designated working groups; to repeal
- 3 section 50-06-43.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the children's cabinet; and to
- 4 provide for a legislative management report.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 7 and enacted as follows:
- 8 <u>Children's cabinet Membership Duties Working groups Report.</u>
- 1. The children's cabinet is created to assess, guide, and coordinate the care for children
 and families across the state's branches of government and the tribal nations.
- 11 2. The children's cabinet is composed of:
- 12 <u>a. The governor, or the governor's designee;</u>
 - b. The chief justice of the supreme court, or the chief justice's designee;
- 14 <u>c.</u> Two members of the house of representatives, appointed by the majority leader

 15 <u>of the house of representatives to serve two-year terms;</u>
- 16 <u>d.</u> Two members of the senate, appointed by the majority leader of the senate to

 17 <u>serve two-year terms;</u>
- 18 <u>e. The superintendent of public instruction, or the superintendent's designee;</u>
- 19 <u>f. The director of the committee on protection and advocacy, or the director's</u>
 20 designee;
- g. The commissioner of the department of health and human services, or the
 commissioner's designee;

1		h. A representative of the tribal nations in the state, who is appointed by the			
2			gove	ernor; and	
3		i. Five individuals, appointed by the governor to serve a term of two years at the			
4			plea	asure of the governor, consisting of:	
5			<u>(1)</u>	A local school representative;	
6			<u>(2)</u>	A local special education representative;	
7			<u>(3)</u>	A human service zone director;	
8			<u>(4)</u>	A representative of a private agency that provides direct services to	
9				vulnerable children; and	
10			<u>(5)</u>	A parent.	
11	<u>3.</u>	<u>The</u>	gove	ernor, in collaboration with the chairman of the legislative management, shall	
12		<u>app</u>	oint a	as the presiding officer of the children's cabinet a member of the governor's	
13		<u>cab</u>	inet o	or a legislator serving on the children's cabinet. The children's cabinet shall	
14		<u>sele</u>	ect on	e of its members to serve as the vice-presiding officer.	
15	<u>4.</u>	The children's cabinet shall meet at least quarterly. Additional meetings may be held at			
16		the	discre	etion of the presiding officer.	
17	<u>5.</u>	The children's cabinet shall:			
18		<u>a.</u>	Coo	ordinate broad-based leadership across programs, agencies, branches of	
19			gove	ernment, and tribal nations to meet the needs of children and families;	
20		<u>b.</u>	<u>Dev</u>	relop strategies to address gaps or needs regarding early care and education,	
21			med	dical and behavioral health, community, child welfare, and juvenile justice;	
22		<u>C.</u>	<u>Dev</u>	relop strategies to provide for the full continuum of care in the delivery of	
23			serv	vices, including promotion, prevention, early identification and intervention,	
24			serv	vice delivery, and recovery;	
25		<u>d.</u>	<u>See</u>	k to engage cooperation across public and private service providers;	
26		<u>e.</u>	Prov	vide a comprehensive vision for how and where children are best served,	
27			atte	nding to children and families in a respectful and relevant manner;	
28		<u>f.</u>	<u>See</u>	k strategies to provide services to children without consideration of prior	
29			eng	agement with juvenile services;	
30		<u>g.</u>	Prov	vide for the active participation of consumers and providers statewide on	
31			advi	isory committees:	

1		<u>h.</u>	Receive information and recommendations from the department of health and
2			human services, department of corrections and rehabilitation, and other state
3			agencies;
4		<u>i.</u>	Establish and oversee designated working groups to develop policies impacting
5			children and families; and
6		<u>j.</u>	Provide an annual report to the legislative management and governor regarding
7			the activities and findings of:
8			(1) The children's cabinet; and
9			(2) Other designated working groups on children and family issues.
10	<u>6.</u>	The	office of the governor shall provide staffing and administrative services for the
11		<u>chil</u>	dren's cabinet and coordinate with other designated working groups on children
12		and	family issues.
13	<u>7.</u>	<u>a.</u>	The presiding officer of the children's cabinet may designate working groups and
14			appoint or remove liaisons to serve on the working groups.
15		<u>b.</u>	A member of the children's cabinet or working group who is not a state employee
16			is entitled to reimbursement for mileage and expenses as provided by law for
17			state officers and employees, to be paid by the office of the governor.
18		<u>C.</u>	A state employee who is a member of the children's cabinet or working group is
19			entitled to receive that employee's regular salary and is entitled to reimbursement
20			for mileage and expenses to be paid by the employing agency.
21		<u>d.</u>	A member of the children's cabinet or working group who is a member of the
22			legislative assembly is entitled to receive per diem compensation at the rate
23			provided under section 54-35-10 for each day performing official duties of the
24			children's cabinet or working group. The legislative council shall pay the per diem
25			compensation and reimbursement for travel and such expenses as provided by
26			law for any member of the children's cabinet or working group who is a member
27			of the legislative assembly.
