- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-02-11 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the accreditation of schools.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-02-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

10			achiev	ement and bear a direct relationship to improving student achievement.		
11		<u>b.</u>	<u>May pr</u>	ovide schools with a choice of accreditation options, including:		
12			<u>(1)</u> <u>A</u>	ccreditation through a state-defined accreditation process established by		
13			<u>th</u>	ne superintendent of public instruction; or		
14			<u>(2)</u> <u>A</u>	ccreditation through a nationally recognized accrediting organization, a		
15			fc	ormal school improvement organization, or a continuous improvement		
16			<u>0</u>	rganization approved by the superintendent of public instruction.		
17		<u>C.</u>	<u>May es</u>	stablish a process to select the accreditation options for schools and a		
18			proces	s for schools to select an accreditation option. Development of the process		
19			<u>may in</u>	clude input and participation from a steering committee, including		
20			repres	entatives of education stakeholder groups, school administrators,		
21			second	dary and elementary school principals, and school board members.		

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	d. Periodically shall review and evaluate the effectiveness of each accreditation		
	option in improving student achievement and school performance.		
<u>2.</u>	Each accreditation option must:		
	a. Meet or exceed the state standards to ensure consistency in the quality of		
	education.		
	b. Provide measurable outcomes for student achievement, aligning with the state		
	goals.		
<u>3.</u>	A school may select the accreditation option best aligning to the instructional goals		
	and operational needs of the school, subject to approval by the superintendent of		
	public instruction.		
<u>4.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction shall contract with an accreditation		
	organization or vendor to create state-provided accreditation to offer to each public		
	school district at no charge.		
<u>5.</u>	If a district chooses to use an accreditation process from the state-approved list, the		
	district is responsible for any accreditation-related costs.
