4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-27-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is

17		ave	rage daily membership by adding the products derived under subsection 1 to the			
18		dist	rict's average daily membership.
