- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 23-27-01 and 23-27-02 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the licensing of emergency medical services operations.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 23-27-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

## 23-27-01. License required - Licensing of emergency medical services operations Exception - Waiver.

- 8 1. The department of health and human services shall license emergency medical
  9 services operations and may designate their service areas. The department shall limit
  10 the issuance of a license for any new emergency medical services operation based on
  11 the needs of the service area. A license for an emergency medical services operation
  12 is nontransferabletransferable upon approval of the department.
- Emergency medical services may not be advertised, offered, or provided to the public
   except by an emergency medical services operator that provides the emergency
   medical services through emergency medical services personnel.
- 163. Except as otherwise provided under subsection 4, anAn emergency medical services17operatorservices operation must be separately licensed for each of the operator's
- 18 emergency medical services operations and an operation that is headquartered from a-

24	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 23-27-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is

27	For the purpose of this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:		
28	1.	"De	partment" means the department of health and human services.
29	2.	"Em	nergency medical services" means the prehospital medical stabilization or
30		tran	sportation, including interfacility transportation, of an individual who is sick, injured,
31		wou	inded, or otherwise incapacitated or helpless, or in a real or perceived acute

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1		medical condition, by a person that holds oneself out to the public as being in that
2		service or that regularly provides that service. The term includes:
3		a. Assessing, stabilizing, and treating life-threatening and non-life-threatening
4		medical conditions; or
5		b. Transporting a patient who is in a real or perceived acute medical condition to a
6		hospital emergency room or other appropriate medical destination.
7	3.	"Emergency medical services operation" means an entity licensed to offer and provide
8		emergency medical services by emergency medical services personnel with physician
9		oversight. The term includes basic life support ambulance services, advanced life
10		support ambulance services, air ambulance services, and quick response unit
11		services.
12	4.	"Emergency medical services personnel" means individuals who provide emergency
13		medical services for emergency medical services operations. The term includes
14		emergency medical services professionals, drivers, and department-certified
15		emergency medical services providers, such as cardiopulmonary resuscitation drivers
16		and first responders.
17	5.	"Emergency medical services professional" means an individual licensed by the
18		department under this chapter.
19	<u>6.</u>	"Substation ambulance services" means an ambulance station that has its own service
20		area designated by the department and is not individually licensed as an emergency
21		medical services operation.
