## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 39-12-05 of the North Dakota Century
  Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
  - 2. Subject to the limitations imposed by subsection 1 on tires, wheel, and axle loads, the gross weight of which exceeds that determined by the formula of:

$$W = 500 (LN/N-1 + 12N + 36)$$

- where W equals maximum weight in pounds carried on any group of more than one axle; L equals distance in feet between the extremes of any group of consecutive axles; and N equals number of axles in the group under consideration, except that two consecutive sets of tandem axles may carry a gross load of thirty-four thousand pounds [15422.14 kilograms] each, providing the overall distance between the first and last axles of the consecutive sets of tandem axles is at least thirty-six feet [10.97 meters]. The gross weight may not exceed eighty thousandone hundred thirteen thousand pounds [36287.3951255.94 kilograms].
- **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 2 of section 39-12-05.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 2. Subject to the limitations imposed by subsection 1 on tires, wheel, and axle loads, a person may not operate on a highway that is not part of the interstate system any vehicle the gross weight of which exceeds that determined by the formula of:

$$W = 500 (LN + 12N + 36)$$

2	where W equals the maximum gross weight in pounds on any vehicle or combination
3	of vehicles; L equals distance in feet between the two extreme axles of any vehicle or
4	combination of vehicles; and N equals the number of axles of any vehicle or
5	combination of vehicles under consideration. The gross weight on stateall highways
6	may not exceed one hundred five thousand five hundred one hundred thirteen
7	thousand pounds [4785451255.94 kilograms] unless otherwise posted and on all other
8	highways the gross weight may not exceed eighty thousand pounds [36287.39-
9	kilograms] unlessor designated by local authorities for highways under their jurisdiction
10	for gross weights not to exceed one hundred five thousand five hundred pounds
11	[47854 kilograms]. Local authorities are encouraged to assess all roads under their
12	jurisdiction and designate the roads for the appropriate weight limits allowed under this
13	subsection.
