## **ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2380**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 51-07 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a commercial entity's liability for publishing or distributing sexual
- 3 material harmful to a minor; to provide a penalty; and to provide for application.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 51-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 6 and enacted as follows:
- 7 Liability for publishing or distributing sexual material harmful to minors - Age 8 verification requirement - Damages.
- 9 1. As used in this section:
- 10 "Commercial entity" includes a corporation, limited liability company, partnership, 11 limited partnership, sole proprietorship, or other legally recognized business 12 entity.
- 13 <u>b.</u> "Distribute" means to issue, sell, give, provide, deliver, transfer, transmute, 14 circulate, or disseminate by any means.
- 15 "Minor" means an individual under eighteen years of age. <u>C.</u>
- 16 "News-gathering organization" means an employee of a: d.
- 17 (1) Newspaper, news publication, or news source, printed or on an online or 18 mobile platform, of current news and public interest, who is acting within the 19 scope of employment and can provide documentation of employment with 20
- the newspaper, news publication, or news source; or
- 21 Radio broadcast station, television broadcast station, cable television <u>(2)</u>
- 22 operator, or wire service, who is acting within the scope of employment and

1 "Substantial portion" means if more than thirty-three and one-third percent of total 2 material on a website is sexual material harmful to a minor. 3 <u>i.</u> "Transactional data" means a sequence of information that documents an 4 exchange, agreement, or transfer between an individual, commercial entity, or 5 third party used for the purpose of satisfying a request or event. The term 6 includes records from mortgage, education, and employment entities. 7 2. A commercial entity that knowingly publishes or distributes sexual material harmful to 8 a minor on the internet from a website that contains a substantial portion of the 9 material must be held liable if the entity fails to perform reasonable age verification 10 methods to verify the age of an individual attempting to access the material. 11 A commercial entity or third party that performs the required age verification may not 12 retain any identifying information of the individual after access has been granted to the 13 material. 14 A commercial entity found to have violated subsection 2 or 3 is liable for damages. <u>4.</u> 15 <u>5.</u> A civil action may be brought against any commercial entity, or third party that 16 performs the required age verification on behalf of the commercial entity, by: 17 A parent or quardian whose minor child was allowed access to the material in <u>a.</u> 18 violation of subsection 2; or 19 An individual whose identifying information is retained in violation of subsection 3. 20 An individual authorized to bring a civil action under subsection 5 may seek and the <u>6.</u> 21 court may award: 22 An injunction to enjoin continued violation of this section; a. 23 <u>b.</u> Compensatory and exemplary damages; and 24 <u>C.</u> Costs and fees, including reasonable attorney fees. 25 <u>7.</u> This section does not apply to any bona fide news or public interest broadcast, 26 website video, report, or event, and may not be construed to affect the rights of any 27 news-gathering organization. 28 An internet service provider or its affiliates or subsidiaries, a search engine, or a cloud 8. 29 service provider may not be held to have violated this section solely for providing 30 access or connection to or from a website or other information or content on the 31 internet or a facility, system, or network not under the provider's control, including
