- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 54 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to a life science research council; to repeal section 4.1-01-20.1 of the North
- 3 Dakota Century Code, relating to the bioscience innovation grant program; to provide a
- 4 continuing appropriation; to provide an appropriation; to provide for a transfer; and to declare an
- 5 emergency.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 SECTION 1. A new chapter to title 54 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and
- 8 enacted as follows:
- 9 <u>Definitions.</u>
- 10 <u>As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:</u>
- 11 <u>1.</u> <u>"Biotechnology" means a scientific field of study involving cellular and biomolecular</u>
- 12 processes to develop technologies and products that help fight diseases, reduce
- 13 <u>environmental harm, and grow food.</u>
- 14 <u>2.</u> <u>"Life science" means the scientific study of living organisms and their processes.</u>
- <u>"Medical devices" means a medical instrument, apparatus, implant, software, or other</u>
  <u>equipment developed or manufactured for medical purposes.</u>
- 17 <u>4.</u> "Pharmaceuticals" means the practice of discovery, development, and production of
  18 <u>drugs and vaccines that can prevent, treat, and cure diseases.</u>
- 19 Life science research council Membership Meetings.
- 20 The industrial commission shall consult with the life science research council in matters of
- 21 policy affecting the administration of the life science development fund.
- 22 <u>1.</u> <u>The life science research council consists of:</u>
- 23 <u>a.</u> <u>The commissioner of commerce or the commissioner's designee.</u>

1		<u>b.</u>	Two members with a substantial interest in medical devices appointed by the	
2			governor.	
3		<u>C.</u>	Two members with a substantial interest in pharmaceuticals appointed by the	
4			governor.	
5		<u>d.</u>	Two members with a substantial interest in biotechnology appointed by the	
6			governor.	
7	<u>2.</u>	<u>Sub</u>	ject to subsection 6, the term of office for members of the council is three years	
8		but o	of those first appointed, two serve for one year, two serve for two years, and two	
9		<u>serv</u>	<u>ve for three years.</u>	
10	<u>3.</u>	<u>The</u>	commissioner of commerce shall serve as chairman.	
11	<u>4.</u>	The council shall have at least one regular meeting each year and such additional		
12		mee	etings as the chairman determines necessary at a time and place to be fixed by the	
13		<u>chai</u>	irman. A special meeting must be called by the chairman on written request of any	
14		<u>thre</u>	<u>e members. Four members constitute a quorum.</u>	
15	<u>5.</u>	<u>The</u>	council shall recommend to the industrial commission the approval of grants,	
16		<u>loan</u>	ns, or other financial assistance necessary or appropriate for funding, research,	
17		<u>deve</u>	elopment, marketing, and educational projects or activities and any other matters	
18		<u>relat</u>	ted to this chapter.	
19	<u>6.</u>	Men	nbers of the council serve at the pleasure of the governor.	
20	A	Acces	ss to council records.	
21	<u>1.</u>	Mate	erials and data submitted to, or made or received by, the council or industrial	
22		<u>com</u>	mission, to the extent the council or industrial commission determines the	
23		mate	erials or data consist of trade secrets or commercial, financial, or proprietary	
24		<u>info</u>	rmation of individuals or entities applying to or contracting with the commission or	
25		rece	eiving council or industrial commission services under this chapter, are subject to	
26		<u>sect</u>	tion 44-04-18.4.	
27	<u>2.</u>	<u>A pe</u>	erson shall file a request with the council or industrial commission to have material	
28		<u>desi</u>	ignated as confidential under subsection 1. The request must contain any	
29		<u>info</u> i	rmation required by the council or industrial commission and must include:	
30		<u>a.</u>	A general description of the nature of the information sought to be protected.	

1		<u>b.</u>	An explanation of why the information derives independent economic value,		
2			actual or potential, from not being generally known to others.		
3		<u>C.</u>	An explanation of why the information is not readily ascertainable by proper		
4			means by others.		
5		<u>d.</u>	A general description of a person that may obtain economic value from disclosure		
6			or use of the information, and how the person may obtain that value.		
7		<u>e.</u>	A description of the efforts used to maintain the secrecy of the information.		
8	<u>3.</u>	<u>The</u>	information submitted under subsection 2 is confidential. The council or industrial		
9		<u>con</u>	mission shall examine the request and determine whether the information is		
10		<u>rele</u>	vant to the matter at hand and is a trade secret under the definition in section		
11		<u>44-(</u>	04-18.4 or 47-25.1-01. If the council or industrial commission determines the		
12		<u>info</u>	rmation is either not relevant or not a trade secret, the council or industrial		
13		<u>con</u>	mission shall notify the requester and the requester may ask for the return of the		
14		info	rmation and request within ten days of the notice. If no return is sought, the		
15		<u>info</u>	rmation and request are a public record.		
16	<u>4.</u>	<u>The</u>	names or identities of independent technical reviewers on a project or program		
17		and	the names of council members making recommendations are confidential, may		
18		<u>not</u>	be disclosed by the council, and are not public records subject to section 44-04-18		
19		<u>or s</u>	ection 6 of article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota.		
20	Indu	ustrial commission powers.			
21	<u>1.</u>	<u>The</u>	<u>e industrial commission may:</u>		
22		<u>a</u>	Make a grant or loan, and provide other forms of financial assistance as		
23			necessary or appropriate, to a qualified person for funding research,		
24			development, marketing, and educational projects or activities, feasibility studies,		
25			applied research and demonstrations, venture capital investments, and		
26			low-interest loans and loan buydowns to foster the development of the life		
27			science industry. Any financial assistance the commission awards to a project		
28			may not be the project's sole support. Any financial assistance the commission		
29			awards must be conditioned on the assurance the applicant or a third party will		
30			support the project by either monetary or nonmonetary means. The amount of the		
31			additional support is at the commission's discretion.		

1		<u>b.</u>	Provide incentives to expand the life science industry in the state.			
2		<u>C.</u>	Provide incentives for scaleable technologies.			
3		<u>d.</u>	Provide incentives to increase research and utilization of the life science industry			
4			in the state.			
5		<u>e.</u>	Execute contracts and all other instruments necessary or convenient for the			
6			performance of its powers and functions under this chapter.			
7		<u>f.</u>	Accept aid, grants, or contributions of money or other things of value from any			
8			source, to be held, used, and applied to carry out this chapter, subject to the			
9			conditions upon which the aid, grants, or contributions are made, including aid,			
10			grants, or contributions from any department, agency, or instrumentality of the			
11			United States for any purpose consistent with this chapter.			
12		<u>g.</u>	Establish interest buydown programs for equipment needed to development the			
13			life science industry in the state.			
14		<u>h.</u>	Fund technical assistance from the university system and private entities to			
15			producers.			
16	<u>2.</u>	<u>The</u>	e industrial commission may contract with the department of commerce to provide			
17		<u>tec</u>	hnical assistance to the life science research council and the industrial commission			
18		to carry out the purposes of this chapter, including pursuit of aid, grants, or				
19		<u>cor</u>	tributions of money or other things of value from any source for any purpose			
20		<u>cor</u>	nsistent with this chapter. The department may contract with a public or private third			
21		par	ty to provide the technical assistance necessary to implement the purposes of this			
22	<u>chapter.</u>					
23	Life science development fund - Continuing appropriation.					
24	The life science development fund is a special fund in the state treasury. All funds in the life					
25	5 science development fund are appropriated to the industrial commission on a continuing basis					
26	for the purpose of carrying out this chapter. Interest earned by the fund must be credited to the					
27	<u>fund.</u>					
28	SECTION 2. REPEAL. Section 4.1-01-20.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.					
29	SECTION 3. TRANSFER - BIOSCIENCE INNOVATION GRANT FUND TO LIFE SCIENCE					
30	DEVELOPMENT FUND. The office of management and budget shall transfer any balance in					
31	the bioscience innovation grant fund to the life science development fund on June 30, 2025.					

## 1 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER TO LIFE SCIENCE DEVELOPMENT FUND.

- 2 There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise
- 3 appropriated, the sum of \$12,000,000, which the office of management and budget shall
- 4 transfer to the life science development fund, for the period beginning with the effective date of
- 5 this Act, and ending June 30, 2027.
- 6 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. Sections 1, 3, and 4 of this Act are declared to be an
- 7 emergency measure.
