PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO

HOUSE BILL NO. 1562

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-07-34 of the North Dakota Century Code,
2 relating to training for mandated reporters of suspected child abuse or neglect; and to repeal
3 section 15.1-19-29 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to training for mandated
4 reporters of suspected child abuse or neglect.

5 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-07-34 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 **15.1-07-34. Youth behavioral health and child abuse and neglect training for**
9 **teachers, administrators, and ancillary staff.**

- 10 1. Every two years, ~~each~~ school district may provide a minimum of eight hours of
11 professional development on youth behavioral health, child abuse, and child neglect to
12 elementary, middle, and high school teachers; and administrators. ~~Each~~ school
13 district may encourage ancillary and support staff to participate in the professional
14 development. Based on the annual needs assessment of the school district, these
15 hours may be designated from the following categories:
- 16 a. Trauma;
 - 17 b. Social and emotional learning, including resiliency;
 - 18 c. Suicide prevention;
 - 19 d. Bullying;

- 1 e. Understanding of the prevalence and impact of youth behavioral health wellness
2 on family structure, education, juvenile services, law enforcement, and health
3 care and treatment providers;
- 4 f. Knowledge of behavioral health symptoms; and risks;
- 5 g. Awareness of referral sources and evidence-based strategies for appropriate
6 interventions;
- 7 h. Other evidence-based strategies to reduce risk factors for students; or
- 8 i. Current or new evidence-based behavior prevention or mitigation techniques.
- 9 2. Each school within a district shall designate an individual as a behavioral health
10 resource coordinator.
- 11 3. The superintendent of public instruction shall collaborate with regional education
12 associations to disseminate information, training and instructional materials, and
13 notice of training opportunities to school districts and nonpublic schools. ~~This~~The
14 training must qualify for continuing education credits that count toward license
15 renewal.
- 16 4. The superintendent of public instruction shall maintain the contact information of the
17 behavioral health resource coordinator in each school.
- 18 5. Before initial licensure and each subsequent renewal of licensure, a public or
19 nonpublic school teacher, administrator, librarian, and counselor shall complete the
20 online interactive training module provided by the department of health and human
21 services for mandated reporters of suspected child abuse or neglect and provide
22 documentation of the completed training to the education standards and practices
23 board. The training must qualify for continuing education credits that count toward
24 license renewalsubmit documentation to the education standards and practices board
25 verifying completion of a mandated reporter training program for suspected child
26 abuse or neglect. The department of health and human services shall develop and
27 provide an online interactive training module that may be used by a college of teacher
28 education, an individual educator, and an educational institution to fulfill the training
29 requirement. A college, school, and regional education association may offer a
30 mandated reporter training program that satisfy the requirements outlined in this
31 section for subsequent trainings at the district level.

1 **SECTION 2. REPEAL.** Section 15.1-19-29 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
