- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 4.1 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to regulation of biostimulants and beneficial substances; and to provide a penalty.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** A new chapter to title 4.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 5 enacted as follows:
- 6 Definitions. 7 1. "Beneficial substance" means a substance or compound, other than primary. 8 secondary, or microplant nutrients, but excluding which includes a plant amendment, 9 plant biostimulant, plant inoculant, soil amendment, soil inoculant, and other chemical 10 or biological materials benefiting the growing environment of plants. The term does not 11 include a primary, secondary, or microplant nutrient or pesticides, demonstrated by 12 scientific research to be beneficial to one or more species of plants, soil, or media. 13 "Brand" means a term, designation, trademark, product name, or other specific <u>2.</u> 14 designation under which an individual beneficial substance is offered for sale. 15 "Bulk" means products in nonpackaged form. <u>3.</u> 16 <u>4.</u> "Distribute" means to import, consign, manufacture, produce, compound, mix, or blend 17 beneficial substances, or offer for sale, sell, barter, or otherwise supply beneficial 18 substances in the state.

1	<u>5.</u>	"Distributor" means a person that imports, consigns, manufactures, produces,
2		compounds, mixes, or blends beneficial substances, or offers for sale, sells, barters, or
3		otherwise supplies beneficial substances in the state.
4	<u>6.</u>	"Label" means the display of all written, printed, or graphic matter upon the immediate
5		container or statement accompanying a beneficial substance.
6	<u>7.</u>	"Labeling" means informational materials advertising the sale of a beneficial
7		substance, which includes a written, printed, graphic, or electronic communication.
8	8.	"Official sample" means any sample of a beneficial substance taken by the
9		commissioner or the commissioner's agent and designated as official by the
10	I	commissioner.
11	<mark>8.</mark> 9.	"Person" means an individual or organization.
12	10.	"Plant amendment" means a substance applied to a plant or seed intended to improve
13		growth, yield, product quality, reproduction, flavor, or other favorable characteristics of
14		plants. The term does not include fertilizers, soil amendments, agricultural liming
15		materials, animal and vegetable manure, pesticides, plant regulators, and other
16		materials which may be exempt by regulation.
17	11.	"Plant biostimulant" means a substance or micro-organism that, when applied to
18		seeds, plants, the rhizosphere, soil, or other growth media, supports a plant's natural
19		nutrition processes independently of the biostimulant's nutrient content, which
20		ultimately improves nutrient availability, uptake, or use efficiency; tolerance to abiotic
21		stress; and consequent growth, development, quality, or yield.
22	12.	"Plant inoculant" means a product consisting of micro-organisms applied to a plant or
23		soil to enhance the availability or uptake of plant nutrients through the root system.
24	13.	"Registrant" means the person that registers the beneficial substance that bears the
25	1	person's company name on the label and is the guarantor.
26	<u>9.14.</u>	"Soil amendment" means any substance or a mixture of substances which is intended
27		to improve the physical, chemical, biochemical, biological, or other characteristic of the
28		soil. The term does not include fertilizers, agricultural liming materials, unmanipulated
29	1	animal manures, unmanipulated vegetable manures, pesticides, and other materials
30		exempt by regulation.

1	15.	"Soil inoculant" means a microbial product applied to colonize soil to benefit soil		
2		chemistry, biology, or structure.		
3	Rec	Required labeling.		
4	<u>1.</u>	1. Except for materials exempt under this chapter, the label on a beneficial substance		
5		must contain in a readable and conspicuous form:		
6		a. The brand, including the product name;		
7		b. The net weight or net volume in both customary and metric measurements;		
8		c. The name and address of the guarantor, registrant, and manufacturer;		
9		d. A statement identifying the purpose of the product;		
10		e. The directions for intended use; and		
11		f. A statement of composition showing the amount of each ingredient, which is the		
12		agent in a product primarily responsible for the intended effects, and a statement		
13		noting, in case of bulk shipments, the information in written or printed form must		
14		accompany delivery and be supplied to the purchaser at time of		
15		deliverycontaining the:		
16		(1) Name and percentage of each beneficial substance;		
17		(2) Genus and species of the micro-organism, if applicable; and		
18		(3) Specific measurement of the colony forming unit or other acceptable unit.		
19	<u>2.</u>	For a product claiming micro-organisms, the labels must include the:		
20		a. Information required under subsection 1;		
21		b. Expiration date for use; and		
22		c. Appropriate storage conditions and practices.		
23	3.	If an ingredient not presently defined by an association of plant food control officials in		
24		the United States is used in a beneficial substance, the label must include efficacy		
25		data to support beneficial substance ingredient claims.		
26	4.	If a material used in a beneficial substance is used as a pesticide or plant regulator,		
27		the material must be registered with the United States environmental protection		
28		agency or the commissioner.		
29	5.	If a beneficial substance is part of a bulk shipment, the information provided under		
30		subsection 1 must accompany delivery and be supplied to the purchaser at the time of		
31		<u>delivery.</u>		

1	<u>Dis</u>	<u>tributor's license - Fees.</u>
2	<u>1.</u>	A person may not distribute a beneficial substance in this state without first obtaining a
3		distributor's license from the commissioner.
4	<u>2.</u>	A license is required for each location or mobile mechanical unit used by a distributor
5		in the state.
6	<u>3.</u>	The application for a license must be submitted on a form furnished by the
7		commissioner and must be accompanied by a fee of one hundred dollars.
8	<u>4.</u>	A license is effective for a two-year period beginning July first and ending June thirtieth
9		of each even-numbered year.
10	<u>5.</u>	A license renewal application received after July thirty-first must be assessed a penalty
11		of one hundred dollars per location.
12	<u>6.</u>	A license issued under this section:
13		a. <u>Is not transferable;</u>
14		b. Must be conspicuously posted at each location used by the distributor; and
15		c. Must be carried in each mobile mechanical unit operated by the distributor in the
16		state.
17	<u>7.</u>	The commissioner shall forward all fees received under this section to the state
18		treasurer for deposit in the environment and rangeland protection fund.
19	<u>Pro</u>	duct registration - Fees.
20	<u>1.</u>	Each brand and grade of fertilizer, fertilizer material, micronutrient, specialty fertilizer,
21		soil amendment, and plant amendmenta beneficial substance must be registered in
22		the name of the person appearing on the label before being offered for sale or
23		distributed in this state.
24	<u>2.</u>	The application for registration must be submitted to the commissioner on a form
25		furnished by the commissioner and must be accompanied by a:
26		a. Current product label; and
27		b. Fee of fifty dollars per product.
28	<u>3.</u>	Each brand and grade registration is effective for a two-year period beginning July first
29		and ending June thirtieth of each even-numbered year.
30	<u>4.</u>	A request for a registration renewal received after July thirty-first must be assessed a
31		penalty of one hundred dollars per product.

1	<u>5.</u>	A distributor is not required to register a product listed in subsection 1 if that product is
2		already registered by another person, provided the label complies with the issued
3		registration.
4	<u>6.</u>	The commissioner shall forward all fees received under this section to the state
5		treasurer for deposit in the environment and rangeland protection fund.
6	Insp	pection fee.
7	<u>1.</u>	An inspection fee of ten dollars or twenty cents per ton [907.18 kilograms], whichever
8		is greater, must be paid to the commissioner on all fertilizer, fertilizer material,
9		micronutrients, and specialty fertilizera beneficial substance distributed in this state.
10	<u>2.</u>	This subsection does not apply to:
11		a. Exchanges of product between a manufacturer and distributor; or
12		b. An individual fertilizer, a fertilizer material, micronutrient, or specialty
13		fertilizer, beneficial substance sold exclusively in a package of ten pounds [4.54
14		kilograms] or less.
15	<u>3.</u>	On or before January thirty-first, each licensed person that distributes a fertilizer,
16		fertilizer material, micronutrient, or specialty fertilizer beneficial substance in this state
17		shall:
18		a. File with the commissioner a form stating the number of net tons [kilograms] of
19		each listed product distributed in this state during the preceding calendar year;
20		and
21		b. Submit to the commissioner the inspection fee required by this section.
22	<u>4.</u>	If a person fails to submit an inspection fee, at the time and in the manner required by
23		this section, the commissioner may impose a penalty of ten dollars or ten percent of
24		the amount due, whichever is greater. The requirements of subsection 3 apply only to
25		the last licensed person to handle the same lot of fertilizera beneficial substance.
26	<u>5.</u>	Each distributor shall keep records regarding purchases and sales for three years. The
27		records may be examined by the commissioner upon request.
28	<u>6.</u>	The commissioner shall forward all fees received under this section to the state
29		treasurer for deposit in the environment and rangeland protection fund.

1	<u>Exe</u>	emptions.		
2	<u>1.</u>	When clearly and conspicuously identified on a label, soil amending materials under		
3		<u>this</u>	subsection are exempt, which include:	
4		<u>a.</u>	<u>Hay;</u>	
5		<u>b.</u>	Straw;	
6		<u>C.</u>	<u>Peat;</u>	
7		<u>d.</u>	Leaf mold:	
8		<u>e.</u>	Sand;	
9		<u>f.</u>	Perlite:	
10		<u>g.</u>	Vermiculite:	
11		<u>h.</u>	Gypsum; and	
12		<u>i.</u>	Vermicompost.	
13	<u>2.</u>	<u>Inst</u>	ead of a statement of composition as required in this chapter, the label of the	
14		<u>follc</u>	owing soil amendments when clearly and conspicuously identified on the label must	
15		incl	ude an ingredient statement, unless specific beneficial substance claims are made:	
16		<u>a.</u>	Compost:	
17		<u>b.</u>	Garden soil;	
18		<u>C.</u>	Landscaping soil or topsoil;	
19		<u>d.</u>	Mulch or wood products;	
20		<u>e.</u>	Planting mix;	
21		<u>f.</u>	Potting mix; and	
22		<u>g.</u>	Soilless growing media.	
23	<u>3.</u>	<u>The</u>	commissioner may exempt soil amendments and other products under this	
24		<u>cha</u>	pter.	
25	<u>Car</u>	ncellation of registration.		
26	<u>1.</u>	<u>The</u>	commissioner may cancel the registration of any beneficial substance product or	
27		<u>refu</u>	se to register any beneficial substance product as provided in this chapter due to:	
28		<u>a.</u>	An incomplete or insufficient registration application;	
29		<u>b.</u>	The misbranding or adulteration of a beneficial substance; or	
30		<u>C.</u>	A violation of this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter.	

1	<u>2.</u>	If the commissioner cancels or refuses to renew an existing registration due to the		
2		misbranding or adulteration of a beneficial substance or due to a violation of this		
3		chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter, the registrant or applicant may request a		
4		hearing.		
5	Insp	ection, sampling, and analysis.		
6	<u>1.</u>	The commissioner may act through an authorized agent to sample, inspect, make		
7		analyses of, and test beneficial substances distributed within the state when it is		
8		necessary to determine if a beneficial substance complies within the provisions of this		
9		chapter. The commissioner may enter into or upon any point of distribution during		
10		operating hours upon notice and open and sample any bulk material, bundle, package,		
11		or other container containing or thought to contain a beneficial substance, and to		
12		inspect labels or access records pertaining to the distribution of the beneficial		
13		substance.		
14	<u>2.</u>	The methods of analysis and sampling must be methods approved by the		
15		commissioner, including methods adopted by the journal of the association of		
16		agricultural chemists international.		
17	<u>3.</u>	A single package may constitute an official sample. In determining whether a fertilizer,		
18		fertilizer material, micronutrient, specialty fertilizer, soil amendment, or plant		
19		amendmentbeneficial substance is deficient, the commissioner may consider only the		
20		analysis of the official sample.		
21	<u>4.</u>	If the results of the commissioner's official analysis indicate a fertilizer, fertilizer		
22		material, micronutrient, specialty fertilizer, soil amendment, or plant		
23		amendmentbeneficial substance may be the subject of a penalty or other legal action,		
24		the commissioner shall forward the analysis to the registrant at least ten days before		
25		the report is submitted to the purchaser. If during the ten-day period, no adequate		
26		evidence to the contrary is made available to the commissioner by the registrant, the		
27		report becomes official.		
28	<u>5.</u>	The commissioner shall retain an official sample found to be deficient for thirty days		
29		following the issuance of the analytical report.		
30	<u>6.</u>	Upon request, the commissioner shall furnish to the registrant a portion of a sample		
31		found to be the subject of a penalty or other legal action.		

1	<u>Unla</u>	Unlawful acts.		
2	It is unlawful for a person to:			
3	<u>1.</u>	Distribute an unregistered beneficial substance, unless exempt from the registration		
4		requirements of this section;		
5	<u>2.</u>	Distribute a misbranded or adulterated beneficial substance;		
6	<u>3.</u>	Distribute a beneficial substance if the label does not reflect its composition;		
7	<u>4.</u>	Distribute a product as a beneficial substance if the sole function is to serve as a		
8		pesticide:		
9	<u>5.</u>	Fail to supply the commissioner with an analysis of a beneficial substance when		
10		requested by the commissioner or the commissioner's designee;		
11	<u>6.</u>	Fail to disclose on the label sources of potentially deleterious components;		
12	<u>7.</u>	Fail to cease distribution of any beneficial substance for which the commissioner has		
13		issued a stop sale order; or		
14	<u>8.</u>	Obstruct the commissioner in the performance of the duties under this chapter.		
15	Misbranding of beneficial substance prohibited.			
16	A person may not distribute a misbranded beneficial substance. A beneficial substance is			
17	<u>deemed</u>	to be misbranded if the:		
18	<u>1.</u>	Labeling is false or misleading:		
19	<u>2.</u>	Beneficial substance is distributed under the name of another beneficial substance;		
20		and		
21	<u>3.</u>	Beneficial substance is not labeled as required by this chapter or in accordance with		
22		regulations prescribed under this chapter.		
23	Adulteration of a beneficial substance prohibited.			
24	<u>A pe</u>	erson may not distribute an adulterated beneficial substance. A beneficial substance is		
25	deemed to be adulterated if the beneficial substance:			
26	<u>1.</u>	Contains any deleterious or harmful substance in sufficient amount to render it		
27		injurious to beneficial plant life, animals, humans, aquatic life, soil, or water when		
28		applied in accordance with directions for use on the label;		
29	<u>2.</u>	Does not provide on the label of the substance adequate warning statements and		
30		directions for use, which may be necessary to protect plant life, animals, humans,		
31		aquatic life, soil, or water;		

1	<u>3.</u>	Composition falls below or differs from that which it is purported to possess by its label			
2		or any labeling which describes the composition of the beneficial substance; or			
3	<u>4.</u>	Contains unwanted crop or weed seed, or primary noxious or secondary noxious weed			
4		seed.			
5	<u>Stop</u>	Stop sale order.			
6	<u>lf the</u>	f the commissioner finds the beneficial substance product is being offered or exposed for			
7	sale in violation of this chapter, the commissioner may issue an order to stop the sale or use to				
8	the owne	the owner or custodian of any product containing beneficial substances. The order must remain			
9	in effect	until the commissioner:			
10	<u>1.</u>	Determines the law has been complied with;			
11	<u>2.</u>	Gives written authorization for the disposal of the product; or			
12	<u>3.</u>	Gives written authorization for the product to be offered for sale.			
13	Penalties.				
14	<u>1.</u>	Any person that knowingly violates this chapter is guilty of a class A misdemeanor.			
15	<u>2.</u>	When construing and enforcing the provisions of this chapter, the act, omission, or			
16		failure of any officer, agent, or other person acting for or employed by any person must			
17		be deemed also to be the act, omission, or failure of the person or the employed			
18		person.			
19	<u>3.</u>	A person that violates this chapter or the rules adopted under this chapter is subject to			
20		a civil penalty not to exceed two thousand five hundred dollars per violation. The civil			
21		penalty may be imposed by a court in a civil proceeding or by the agriculture			
22		commissioner through a proceeding under chapter 28-32. The assessment of a civil			
23		penalty does not preclude the imposition of other sanctions authorized by law, this			
24		chapter, or rules adopted under this chapter.			
25	<u>4.</u>	After the hearing, the commissioner may deny, suspend, revoke, or modify the			
26		provision of a certification issued under this chapter, if the commissioner determines			
27		the applicant for certification or the holder of a certificate has violated this chapter or a			
28		rule adopted under this chapter.			
29	<u>Rule</u>	<u>95.</u>			
30	<u>The</u>	commissioner may adopt rules under chapter 28-32 to to effectuate the provisions of			
31	this chap	oter.
