## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO

## SENATE BILL NO. 2332

A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-27 of the North Dakota
Century Code, relating to a legacy earnings emergency services and public safety fund and
advisory board; to amend and reenact section 21-10-13 of the North Dakota Century Code,
relating to the allocation of legacy fund earnings; and to provide a continuing appropriation.for
an Act to provide for a legislative management study of grant funding for emergency services
and public safety.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 21-10-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is

9 amended and reenacted as follows:

10 21-10-13. Legacy earnings fund - State treasurer - Transfers.

- 11 1. There is created in the state treasury the legacy earnings fund. The fund consists of all
   12 moneys transferred to the fund under subsection 2 and all interest and earnings upon
   13 moneys in the fund.
- Any legacy fund earnings transferred to the general fund at the end of each biennium
   in accordance with section 26 of article X of the Constitution of North Dakota must be
   immediately transferred by the state treasurer to the legacy earnings fund.
- 17 3. For each biennium subsequent to the biennium in which the legacy fund earnings are
   18 transferred under subsection 2, the amount available for appropriation from the legacy
   19 earnings fund is seven percent of the five-year average value of the legacy fund 20 assets as reported by the state investment board. The average value of the legacy

1 fund assets must be calculated using the value of the assets at the end of each fiscal-2 year for the five-year period ending with the most recently completed even-numbered 3 fiscal year. 4 On July first of each odd-numbered year, from the amount available for appropriation 5 or transfer from the legacy earnings fund for the biennium, the state treasurer shall-6 transfer funding in the following order: 7 The first one hundred two million six hundred twenty-four thousand dollars or an 8 amount equal to the amount appropriated from the legacy sinking and interest 9 fund for debt service payments for a biennium, whichever is less, to the legacy-10 sinking and interest fund under section 6-09.4-10.1. 11 The next two hundred twenty-five million dollars to the general fund to provide b. 12 support for tax relief initiatives approved by the legislative assembly. 13 The next one hundred million dollars to the legacy earnings highway distribution 14 fund for allocations under section 54-27-19.3. 15 d. The next twenty-five million dollars to the legacy earnings emergency services 16 and public safety fund under section 2 of this Act. 17 Any remaining amounts under this subsection as follows: 18 (1) Fifty percent to the general fund. 19 (2) The remaining fifty percent to the strategic investment and improvements 20 fund to be used in accordance with the provisions of section 15-08.1-08. 21 If the amounts transferred under subsection 2 exceed the amount available for-22 appropriation under subsection 3, the state treasurer shall transfer the excess and any-23 remaining amounts after the transfers and appropriations under subsection 4, as-24 follows: 25 a. Fifty percent to the general fund. 26 The remaining fifty percent to the strategic investment and improvements fund to-27 be used in accordance with the provisions of section 15-08.1-08. 28 SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 54-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 29 and enacted as follows:

30		<u>c. The following ex-officio, nonvoting technical members, appointed by the</u>	
31		governor.	

1	(1) <u>A representative of the bureau of criminal investigation as recommended by</u>
2	the attorney general.
3	<u>(2) A representative of the department of emergency services.</u>
4	<u>(3) A representative of the department of transportation.</u>
5	—(4) <u>A representative of the highway patrol.</u>
6	(5) <u>A representative of the parks and recreation department.</u>
7	(6) <u>A representative of the game and fish department.</u>
8	(7) A representative of the state fire marshal's office as recommended by the
9	insurance commissioner.

11	<u>— 3. The advisory board shall receive and review applications to provide grants to political</u>
12	subdivisions and tribal governments, including rural fire districts and emergency
13	medical services providers. In reviewing the applications, the board shall rank and
14	award grant applications that address the following priorities:
15	<u>a.</u> <u>Recruiting and retaining qualified public safety personnel.</u>
16	<u>b.</u> Assisting communities with shared services agreements to ensure public safety
17	coverage.
18	<u>c. Expanding resources to ensure timely emergency response in all areas of the</u>
19	state, including pilot programs for a tiered response framework.
20	<u>d.</u> Providing funding to modernize the delivery of emergency services and public
21	safety through innovations at the community and regional level.
22	e. Establishing response teams to respond to mental health emergencies to reduce
23	reliance on law enforcement resources.
24	f. Ensuring access and implementation of appropriate technology and
25	communications infrastructure.
26	g. Identifying or designating an entity to provide technical assistance to covered
27	entities to aid in securing funding from other sources.
28	<u>4. The department of emergency services shall administer the grant program and provide</u>
29	staff services to the advisory board.
30	SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - GRANT FUNDING FOR
31	EMERGENCY SERVICES AND PUBLIC SAFETY. During the 2025-26 interim, the legislative

- 1 management shall consider studying options to provide grant funding for emergency services
- 2 and public safety. The study must include a review of the amount of grant funding needed,
- 3 potential funding sources, entities to be eligible to receive a grant, types of expenses to be
- 4 eligible for reimbursement through a grant program, the appropriate agency to administer a
- 5 grant program, and options to establish a grant program oversight committee. The legislative
- 6 management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation
- 7 required to implement the recommendations, to the seventieth legislative assembly.
