1	A BILL for an Act to create and enact twoa new sections to chapter 19-24.1 of the North
2	Dakota Century Code, relating to qualifying senior and nonresident medical marijuana patients
3	to amend and reenact subsection 4 of section 19-24.1-01, subsection 8 of section 19-24.1-01,
4	subsection 26 of section 19-24.1-01, subsection 47 of section 19-24.1-01, and sections
5	19-24.1-03, 19-24.1-03.1, 19-24.1-11, and 19-24.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code,
6	relating to medical marijuana recordkeeping, cannibinoid edible products, patient qualifications
7	and disclosure of information.

## 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 4 of section 19-24.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
  - 4. "Bona fide provider-patient relationship" means a treatment or counseling relationship between a health care provider and patient in which all the following are present:
    - a. The health care provider has reviewed the patient's relevant medical records and completed a full assessment of the patient's medical history and current medical condition, including a relevant, in-person, medical evaluation of the patient.
    - The health care provider has created and maintained records of the patient's condition in accordance with medically accepted standards.
    - c. The patient is under the health care provider's continued care for the debilitating medical condition that qualifies the patient for the medical use of marijuana.

1 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 19-24.1-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 2 amended and reenacted as follows: 3 19-24.1-03.1. Qualifying patients - Veterans. 4 In lieu of the written certification required under section 19-24.1-03, a veteran receiving-5 treatment from a federal veterans' affairs entity may submit to the department a copy of the 6 veterans' affairs medical records identifying a diagnosis of a debilitating medical condition and a 7 copy of military discharge documents and an attestation the veteran is diagnosed with a 8 debilitating medical condition. The department may use the medical records and discharge 9 documents and attestation in place of a written certification to approve or deny the application 10 under section 19-24.1-05. The department shall issue a registry identification card within thirty 11 calendar days of approving an application under this section. 12 SECTION 7. A new section to chapter 19-24.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 13 and enacted as follows: 14 **Qualifying patients - Seniors.** 15 In lieu of the written certification required under section 19-24.1-03, a resident of the state 16 over the age of fifty may submit to the department a copy of the patient's driver's license or 17 department-approved identification and an attestation the individual has been diagnosed with a 18 debilitating medical condition. The department may use the driver's license or department-19 approved identification and attestation in place of a written certification to approve or deny the 20 application under section 19-24.1-05. The department shall issue a registry identification card 21 within thirty calendar days of approving an application under this section. 22 SECTION 7. A new section to chapter 19-24.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 23 and enacted as follows: 24 **Qualifying patients - Nonresidents.** 25 In lieu of the written certification required under section 19-24.1-03, a nonresident who 26 holds a valid out-of-state medical marijuana card issued by the state in which the nonresident 27 resides, may submit to the department a copy of the nonresident's out-of-state department-28 approved identification and a copy of an out-of-state medical marijuana card. The department-29 approved identification and out-of-state medical marijuana card must be issued by the same 30 state. The department may use the out-of-state department-approved identification and 31 out-of-state medical marijuana card in place of a written certification to approve or deny the

The department shall issue a registry identification card 2 within thirty calendar days of approving an application under this section. The issued registry 3 identification card expiration date must be the same as the out-of-state medical marijuana card. 4 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 19-24.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows: 6 19-24.1-11. Registry identification cards. 7 The contents of a registry identification card must include: 8 The name of the cardholder; a. 9 A designation as to whether the cardholder is a qualifying patient, designated b. 10 caregiver, or compassion center agent; 11 A designation as to whether a qualifying patient is a minor; C. 12 d. A designation as to whether a qualifying patient or a designated caregiver's 13 qualifying patient is authorized to use an enhanced amount of dried leaves or 14 flowers of the plant of the genus cannabis to treat or alleviate the patient's 15 debilitating medical condition of cancer; 16 The date of issuance and expiration date; e. 17 f. A random ten-digit alphanumeric identification number containing at least four 18 numbers and at least four letters which is unique to the cardholder; 19 If the cardholder is a designated caregiver, the random identification number of g. 20 the qualifying patient the designated caregiver is authorized to assist: 21 h. A photograph of the cardholder; and 22 The phone number or website address at which the card can be verified. i. 23 Except as otherwise provided in this section or rule adopted under this chapter, a 2. 24 registry identification card expiration date must be valid for one year afterfrom the 25 date of issuance for first time qualifying patients. 26 If a health care provider limits the written certification until a specified date, less than 3. 27 one year, the registry identification card expires on that dateA registry identification
  - one year, the registry identification card expires on that date A registry identification card renewal is valid for two years from the date of issuance for a qualifying patient who previously was issued a registry identification card.
  - **SECTION 9. AMENDMENT.** Section 19-24.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

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## 19-24.1-37. Confidentiality.

- Except as provided under subsection 2, information kept or maintained by the
  department is confidential, including information in a registration application or renewal
  and supporting information submitted by a qualifying patient, designated caregiver,
  compassion center, proposed compassion center, or compassion center agent,
  including information on designated caregivers and health care providers.
  - 2. Information kept or maintained by the department may be disclosed as necessary for:
    - The verification of registration certificates and registry identification cards under this chapter;
    - b. Submission of the annual report required by this chapter;
    - c. Submission to the North Dakota prescription drug monitoring program;
    - d. Notification of state or local law enforcement of apparent criminal violation;
    - e. Notification of state and local law enforcement about falsified or fraudulent information submitted for purposes of obtaining or renewing a registry identification card;
    - f. Notification of the North Dakota board of medicine or North Dakota board of nursing if there is a reason to believe a health care provider provided a written certification and the department has reason to believe the health care provider otherwise violated this chapter; or
    - g. Data for statistical purposes in a manner such that an individual or compassion center is not identified.
  - 3. Upon a cardholder's written request, the department may confirm the cardholder's status as a registered qualifying patient or a registered designated caregiver to a third party, such as a landlord, school, medical professional, or court.
  - Information submitted to a local government to demonstrate compliance with any security requirements required by local zoning ordinances or regulations is confidential.
- 5. Upon written request of a compassion center or a compassion center's designee, the
  department shall comply with a request for information to a third party when necessary
  for the business operation of a compassion center.
