- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-09.1-02.1 and 54-44.4-02 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to regional education associations.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-09.1-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **15.1-09.1-02.1. Regional education association - Services to be offered.**

7	1.	In order to To be eligible for state funding, a regional education association mustshall
8		offer the following services to its member districts:

- 9 a. Coordination and facilitation of professional development activities for teachers
 10 and administrators employed by its member districts;
- 11 b. Supplementation of technology support services;
- c. Assistance with achieving school improvement goals identified by the
 superintendent of public instruction;
- 14 d. Assistance with the collection, analysis, and interpretation of student
 15 achievement data; and
- 16 e. Assistance with the expansion and enrichment of curricular offerings.
- 17 2. Subsection 1 does not preclude a regional education association from offering
- additional services, including services to a district that is not a member of the regional
 education association.
- <u>A regional education association may enter a contract with the superintendent of</u>
 <u>public instruction to offer services</u>.
- 22 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 54-44.4-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is

15			statutes in title 38 authorizing the industrial commission to perform well and hole							
16			pluggings, reclamation work, equipment removal, leak prevention, and similar							
17			work.							
18	6.	<u>f.</u>	Services for the maintenance or servicing of equipment by the manufacturer or							
19			authorized servicing agent of that equipment when the maintenance or servicing							
20			can best be performed by the manufacturer or authorized service agent, or when							
21			such a contract would otherwise be advantageous to the state.							
22	7.	<u>g.</u>	Emergency purchases the office of management and budget or a purchasing							
23			agency cannot make within the required time and which involve public health or							
24			public safety, or when immediate expenditures are necessary for repairs of state							
25			property to protect it against further loss or damage, or to prevent or minimize							
26			serious disruption in state services.							
27		a.	(1) Emergency purchases made under this subsection must treat all bidders							
28			fairly and promote competition as is practicable under the circumstances;							
29		b.	(2) The procurement file must contain a written determination of:							
30			(1) (a) The basis for the emergency; and							
31			(2) (b) The basis for the selection of the particular contractor.

8				procurement procedures and documentation are adequate to satisfy
9				requirements for federal reimbursement.

11				may require a sample for use in determining whether an offered product
12				meets specifications.
