## **ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2373**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 53-06.1-01 and subsection 3 of
- 2 section 53-06.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of an alcoholic
- 3 beverage establishment and the permissible locations for gaming.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 53-06.1-01 of the North Dakota					
6	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:					
7	2.	"Alc	oholic beverage establishment" means an establishment licensed under chapter			
8		5-02	2 where alcoholic beverages are sold <del>,</del> <u>and</u> dispensed <del>,</del> <u>by employees of the</u>			
9		<u>esta</u>	ablishment and consumed by guests on the premises. The term does not include a			
10		liqu	or store, gas station, grocery store, or convenience store.			
11	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 53-06.1-03 of the North Dakota					
12	Century	Code	e is amended and reenacted as follows:			
13	3.	A lic	censed organization or organization that has a permit shall conduct games as			
14	follows:					
15		a.	Only one licensed organization or organization that has a permit may conduct			
16			games at an authorized site on a day, except a raffle or a sports pool conducted			
17			under a local permit may be conducted for a special occasion by another			
18			licensed organization or organization that has a permit when one of these			
19			conditions is met:			
20			(1) When the area for the raffle or a sports pool is physically separated from the			
21			area where games are conducted by the regular organization.			

1		(2) Upon request of the regular organization and with the approval of the
2		alcoholic beverage establishment, the regular organization's license or
3		permit is suspended for that specific time of day by the attorney general.
4	b.	Except for a temporary site authorized for fourteen or fewer consecutive days for
5		not more than two events per quarter or a licensed organization authorized on or
6		before January 1, 2023, to conduct gaming at more than fifteen sites, a licensed
7		organization, including a closely related organization, may not have more than
8		fifteen sites.
9	C.	Games of electronic quick shot bingo, electronic pull tabs, pull tabs,
10		punchboards, twenty-one, paddlewheels, poker, and sports pools may be
11		conducted only during the hours when alcoholic beverages may be dispensed
12		according to applicable regulations of the state, county, or city.
13	<u>d.</u>	Electronic pull tabs must, pull tabs, punchboards, twenty-one, paddlewheels,
14		poker, and sports pools may be conducted only within a designated area where
15		patrons must be twenty-one years of age or older to enter, which is located in an
16		alcoholic beverage establishment a designated area where patrons must be
17		twenty-one years of age or older to enteror in a bingo hall that is an authorized
18		site on January 1, 2025, and is owned by a licensed organization.
19	<u>d.e.</u>	An organization may not permit a person under twenty-one years of age to
20		directly or indirectly play electronic pull tabs, pull tabs, punchboards, twenty-one,
21		calcuttas, sports pools, paddlewheels, or poker. An organization may not permit
22		an individual under eighteen years of age to directly or indirectly play electronic
23		quick shot bingo. An organization may not permit an individual under eighteen
24		years of age to directly or indirectly play bingo unless the individual is
25		accompanied by an adult, bingo is conducted by an organization that has a
26		permit, or the game's prize structure does not exceed that allowed for a permit.
27	<del>e.<u>f.</u></del>	An organization may not install more than ten electronic pull tab devices at a site.
28	<del>f.g.</del>	An organization with more than fifteen licensed sites under subdivision b may not
29		increase its number of sites beyond the number of sites licensed as of January 1,
30		2023.

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1	<u>g.h.</u>	An organization conducting gaming at an authorized site on January 1, 2023,
2		may continue to operate gaming, including as provided under subsection 1 of
3		section 53-06.1-06, at the authorized site regardless of whether the authorized
4		site is an alcoholic beverage establishment as defined under section 53-06.1-01.
5	<del>h.<u>i.</u></del>	For a raffle board, an organization permitted to conduct raffles shall sell the
6		numbered squares on the board for the same price and may sell squares at a site
7		thirty days before the drawing.
