- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 12.1-34 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the rights of sexual violence survivors.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 12.1-34 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
and enacted as follows:

6 Sexual violence survivor rights.

7	<u>1.</u>	<u>As</u>	used	in	this	section:

8		<u>a.</u>	"Sexual assault victim advocate" means a victim advocate of a domestic violence
9			sexual assault organization as defined under section 14-07.1-01, or a victim
10			advocate from a children's advocacy center as defined in 50-25.1-02.
11		<u>b.</u>	"Sexual violence survivor" means an individual who is a victim of a crime defined
12			under section 12.1-20-03, 12.1-20-03.1, 12.1-20-04, 12.1-20-05, 12.1-20-05.1,
13			<u>12.1-20-06, 12.1-20-06.1, 12.1-20-07, 12.1-20-11, or 12.1-20-12.3.</u>
14	<u>2.</u>	<u>In a</u>	ddition to the rights provided under section 12.1-34-02, a sexual violence survivor
15	5 <u>must be afforded the following rights.</u>		
16		<u>a.</u>	The right to consult with a sexual assault victim advocate during any forensic
17			medical examination, unless the advocate is not available in a timely manner. A
18			survivor's:
19			(1) Communication with a sexual assault victim advocate is privileged, unless
20			waived by the survivor; and
21			(2) Waiver of the right to a sexual assault victim advocate is privileged.

1	<u>b.</u>	The right to the presence of privately retained counsel when speaking with law
2		enforcement regarding the alleged assault, unless law enforcement is conducting
3		a forensic interview with an alleged child victim.
4	<u>C.</u>	The right to access the law enforcement report prepared for the survivor's case,
5		unless:
6		(1) The survivor is a minor; or
7		(2) Providing access would hinder the investigation.
8	<u>d.</u>	The right to a document prepared by the attorney general explaining the rights of
9		sexual violence survivors under this section and other relevant law. The rights
10		document must be provided by a medical provider or law enforcement officer
11		upon initial contact with the survivor.
