- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 12.1-34 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the rights of sexual violence survivors.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 12.1-34 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 5 and enacted as follows:

8		<u>a.</u>	"Sexual assault victim advocate" means a victim advocate of a domestic violence
9			sexual assault organization as defined under section 14-07.1-01, or a victim

11		<u>b.</u>	"Sexual violence survivor" means an individual who is a victim of a crime defined
12			<u>under section 12.1-20-03, 12.1-20-03.1, 12.1-20-04, 12.1-20-05, 12.1-20-05.1,</u>
13			<u>12.1-20-06, 12.1-20-06.1, 12.1-20-07, 12.1-20-11, or 12.1-20-12.3.</u>
14	<u>2.</u>	<u>In a</u>	ddition to the rights provided under section 12.1-34-02, a sexual violence survivor
15		mus	st be afforded the following rights.

16	<u>a.</u>	The right to consult with a sexual assault victim advocate during any forensic
17		medical examination, unless the advocate is not available in a timely manner. A
18		survivor's:

- 19(1)Communication with a sexual assault victim advocate is privileged, unless20waived by the survivor; and
 - (2) <u>Waiver of the right to a sexual assault victim advocate is privileged.</u>

1	<u>b.</u>	The right to the presence of privately retained counsel when speaking with law
2		enforcement regarding the alleged assault, unless law enforcement is conducting
3		a forensic interview with an alleged child victim.
4	<u>C.</u>	Except as provided by law, the right to access the law enforcement report
5		prepared for the survivor's case at no cost.
6	<u>d.</u>	The right to a document prepared by the attorney general explaining the rights of
7		sexual violence survivors under this section and other relevant law, which must
8		be provided by a medical provider or law enforcement officer upon initial contact
9		with the survivor.
