- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 29-22 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to juror counseling.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 29-22 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
- 5 and enacted as follows:
- 6 <u>Juror counseling following graphic evidence or testimony.</u>
- 7 <u>1. The court shall offer, not more than ten hours of post-trial psychological counseling,</u>
- 8 without charge, to a juror or alternate juror who served on a trial jury in a trial involving
- 9 <u>extraordinarily graphic, gruesome, or emotional evidence or testimony.</u>
- 10 <u>2.</u> The counseling offered under subsection 1 applies only to a juror or alternate juror
- 11 who served on a trial jury for a trial involving the following offenses:
- 12 <u>a. Murder under section 12.1-16-01;</u>
- b. Manslaughter under section 12.1-16-02;
- 14 <u>c. Negligent homicide under section 12.1-16-03;</u>
- 15 <u>d. Felony-level assault or domestic violence under chapter 12.1-17;</u>
- 16 <u>e. A sexual offense under chapter 12.1-20 or 12.1-27.2;</u>
- f. Abuse or neglect of a child under sections 14-09-22 and 14-09-22.1; and
- 18 <u>g. Others as determined by the court.</u>
- 19 <u>3. The counseling offered under this section:</u>
- 20 <u>a. Must occur not later than one hundred eighty days after the jury is discharged;</u>
- 21 <u>b. May be provided by the court system, by a state agency, or by contract; and</u>
- 22 <u>c. May be individual or group counseling.</u>
