SB 2174: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 11-33-02.1, subdivision a of subsection 7 of section 23.1-06-15, and section 58-03-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the regulation of odors in an animal feeding operation and zoning authority over animal feeding operations in counties and townships.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Agriculture and Veterans Affairs Committee**.

Sens. Axtman, Hogan and Reps. O'Brien, Pyle introduced:

SB 2176: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the children's cabinet and designated working groups; to repeal section 50-06-43.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the children's cabinet; to provide for a legislative management report; and to provide an appropriation.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Education Committee**.

Sens. Thomas, Conley, Hogue and Reps. Hagert, Schreiber-Beck, Lefor introduced:

SB 2177: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 57-39.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to an animal agriculture facility infrastructure fund; to amend and reenact section 57-39.2-26 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the allocation of sales tax revenue; and to provide a continuing appropriation.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.

Sens. Walen, Enget and Reps. Koppelman, Heilman introduced:

SB 2178: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 16.1-02-12, 16.1-02-15, 16.1-03-21, and 16.1-07-05, subsection 1 of section 16.1-07-06, sections 16.1-11-10, 16.1-11-12, 16.1-11-21, 16.1-11-22, 16.1-11-24, 16.1-11-26, 16.1-11-29, and 16.1-11-30, subsection 2 of section 16.1-11-39, and sections 16.1-11-40, 16.1-11.1-02, and 16.1-12-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to data stored in the central voter file and primary election ballots.

Was read the first time and referred to the **State and Local Government Committee**.

Sens. Thomas, Boehm, Weber and Reps. D. Anderson, Porter, M. Ruby introduced:

SB 2179: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 23.1-13-16 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to inspection fees.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.

Sens. Paulson, Luick, Weston and Reps. Louser, D. Ruby, D. Johnston introduced:

SB 2180: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 44-04-19 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the opportunity to provide public comment at a meeting of a public entity.

Was read the first time and referred to the **State and Local Government Committee**.

Sens. Rummel, Cleary, Hogue and Reps. Lefor, Ista introduced:

SB 2181: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 65-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to posttraumatic stress disorder duration limits; to amend and reenact subsection 11 of section 65-01-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to workers' compensation coverage for posttraumatic stress disorder; to provide for application; and to provide an expiration date.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Industry and Business Committee**.

Sens. Paulson, Klein, Larson, Myrdal and Reps. Pyle, Louser introduced:

SB 2182: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 28-32-18 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the amendment of an administrative rule by agreement of the agency and administrative rules committee.

Was read the first time and referred to the **State and Local Government Committee**.

Sens. Rummel, Klein, Conley, Meyer and Reps. O'Brien, Grueneich introduced:

SB 2183: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 9 of section 39-06.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a violation of a construction zone speed limit; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Transportation Committee**.

Sens. Clemens, Boehm and Reps. K. Anderson, Frelich, D. Ruby introduced:

SB 2184: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 14-09-06.5 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to additional parenting time after a false allegation of harm to a child.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

Sen. Thomas and Reps. D. Anderson, Vollmer introduced:

SB 2185: A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation to the parks and recreation department for a Lake Metigoshe state park sewer infrastructure replacement grant project.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Appropriations Committee**.

Sens. Clemens, Luick and Reps. Koppelman, Marschall introduced:

SB 2186: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 12.1-18-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the removal or withholding of a child in violation of a custody decree; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.
