Was read the first time and referred to the State and Local Government Committee.

Sens. Patten, Kessel, Sickler and Reps. Bosch, Novak, Porter introduced:

SB 2188: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 54-63.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the membership of the clean sustainable energy authority; and to provide a transfer.

Was read the first time and referred to the Energy and Natural Resources Committee.

Sens. Lee, Boschee, Klein and Reps. Jonas, Mitskog, Pyle introduced:

SB 2189: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 53-06.1-03 and subsection 1 of section 53-06.1-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to reporting the value of prizes distributed by an organization using a permit to conduct raffles, bingo, sports pools, paddlewheels, twenty-one, and poker.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

Sens. Lee, Dever, Hogan and Reps. Stemen, Wagner introduced:

SB 2191: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 12-44.1-24 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to correctional facility standards and the duties of the department of corrections and rehabilitation.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Human Services Committee**.

Sens. Lee, Sickler and Reps. Jonas, Sanford, Schreiber-Beck introduced:

SB 2193: A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 25-13 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the certification and sale of assistance animals; to amend and reenact section 25-13-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to definitions associated with assistance animals; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the Agriculture and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Sens. Lee, Dever, Hogan and Reps. Mitskog, Schreiber-Beck introduced:

SB 2194: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 12-60-24 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to criminal history record checks; to provide an appropriation; to provide for application; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Workforce Development Committee.

Sen. Lee introduced:

SB 2195: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 19-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to requirements for selling aerosol dusters containing difluoroethane; to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 19-03.1-22.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the classification of difluoroethane as a volatile chemical; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Human Services Committee**.

Sens. Roers, Axtman, Gerhardt and Reps. Dobervich, Heinert, Novak introduced:

SB 2196: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 3 of section 15.1-19-16 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to student self-administration of asthma or anaphylaxis medication.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Human Services Committee**.

Sens. Schaible, Patten, Weber introduced:

SB 2197: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 20.1-01-34 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to deer hunting with a crossbow.

Was read the first time and referred to the Energy and Natural Resources Committee.

Sens. Boschee, Cleary, Meyer and Reps. Pyle, Satrom, Schneider introduced:

SB 2198: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 37-01-25 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to national guard or federal service leave of absence for state and political subdivision employees.

Was read the first time and referred to the Workforce Development Committee.

Sens. Wobbema, Luick, Paulson, Weston and Reps. D. Johnston, J. Olson introduced:

SB 2199: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 20.1-03-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to disabled veteran deer hunting licenses.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Energy and Natural Resources Committee**.

Sens. Hogan, Axtman, Lee and Reps. Dobervich, Frelich introduced:

SB 2200: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 50-06 and chapter 57-40.7 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the creation of the 988 crisis hotline program and the 988 crisis stabilization fund and the imposition of a 988 access fee; to provide for a legislative management report; to provide an appropriation; to provide a continuing appropriation; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Industry and Business Committee**.

Sens. Weber, Bekkedahl, Hogue and Reps. Headland, Lefor, Vigesaa introduced:

SB 2201: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 57-02-08.9 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the primary residence credit; to provide for application; to provide a retroactive effective date; to provide an expiration date; and to declare an emergency.

Was read the first time and referred to the Finance and Taxation Committee.

Sens. Schaible, Boehm, Magrum and Reps. Hauck, Nelson introduced:

SB 2202: A BILL for an Act to create and enact three new sections to chapter 4.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the creation of districts, district commission member nomination and election procedures, and the costs of elections of district representative commission members; to amend and reenact sections 4.1-03-01, 4.1-03-02, 4.1-03-03, and 4.1-03-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of a cattle industry representative, the election and terms of members to the North Dakota beef commission, commission vacancies, and requiring livestock auction markets and livestock dealers to forward names of cattle sellers; to provide a penalty; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Agriculture and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Sens. Lee, Barta, Braunberger and Reps. Dobervich, M. Ruby, Schreiber-Beck introduced:

SB 2203: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 43-33-01, subsection 1 of section 43-33-06, subsection 3 of section 43-37-02, and section 43-37-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the consolidation of the board of hearing aid specialists and the board of examiners on audiology and speech-language pathology; and to repeal sections 43-33-15 and 43-33-17 related to the board of hearing aid specialists.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry and Business Committee.

Sens. Barta, Boschee, Dever and Reps. Conmy, Schauer introduced:

SB 2204: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 47-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the required disclosure of radon hazards by a seller.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry and Business Committee.

Sens. Luick, Dever, Myrdal and Reps. Brown, Klemin introduced:

SB 2205: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 53-06.1-11.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the charitable gaming operating fund.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Sens. Conley, Rummel, Clemens and Reps. K. Anderson, Grueneich, Hauck introduced:

SB 2206: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 28-01-18, a new section to chapter 32-03, and a new section to chapter 39-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to civil actions having two-year limitations, limiting noneconomic damages against a commercial motor carrier, and evidence of safety belt usage in civil actions; and to amend and reenact section 39-21-41.4 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to requiring safety belts in certain motor vehicles; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

FIRST READING OF SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

Sens. Conley, Hogue, Thomas, Wanzek and Reps. Headland, Lefor introduced:

SCR 4002: A concurrent resolution urging Congress to enact legislation allowing a landowner to terminate a perpetual easement owned by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service within the state.

Was read the first time and referred to the Agriculture and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Sens. Mathern, Rummel and Reps. Foss, Hanson, Murphy introduced:

SCR 4004: A concurrent resolution declaring April 21, 2025, through April 28, 2025, as "North Dakota Dark Sky Week," and urging the residents of North Dakota to partake in this event to observe, ponder, and support the natural dark sky resources of this state.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Energy and Natural Resources Committee**.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator Klein's motion.
