To whom it may concern,

I am the Site Coordinator at Hope Center for Learning-South in Fargo, ND. We have been licensed since August 2010. Our licensed capacity is 99 and we are currently serving 56 during the school year. We have been participating in Bright & Early since 2017. We are currently rated Step 3 and began working on Step 4 Rating in January 2025. I am writing to this to ask to approve of the ORIGINAL amount that was being awarded (\$7 million), not the reduced to the amount of \$5 million.

I have been the coordinator at Hope Center for Learning-South since 2021. One thing I appreciated from the beginning was the high standard of care that was being provided. As I was getting to know the policies and procedures of the center something I heard frequently was that we do this because of what we've learned through involvement in Bright and Early. The support provided for the staff from the Bright and Early coaches and educators has been an invaluable asset to us providing high quality care to our children and families.

In addition to the support and education provided to us from Bright and Early coaches is the funding that we receive to help us continue to provide a high level of care for the children and families we serve. We received \$8,000 in quality Improvement grants in 2022, 2023, and 2024. Past grant dollars have been used to maintain childcare spaces such as adding new carpeting and having the rooms painted. We have also used this funding to purchase additional furnishing including shelving, chairs, changing station, etc.

The 2024 grant dollars will be used to send all full-time staff (14 staff total) to the ND Early Childhood Conference in Bismarck in April 2025. With these funds we will be able to pay for wages, lodging, food, registration, etc. Being able to provide teachers with quality education opportunities helps us retain high quality early childhood teachers which is the key to any early childhood program. Funding to help us provide education and opportunities for staff is especially important now, when it seems like being able to hire qualified staff is becoming increasingly difficult.
