The only problem with it was that I and my brother had to use small yellow punchcards to "pay" for our lunches and all the other kids saw that. I was only teased by one person but my brother was less lucky and I couldn't help him defend himself since he was in different classes in a different part of the building. It would've been another great grace if we hadn't had to be so "marked" for harassment and abuse by these yellow cards or even standing out because others could see we got our lunches for free when they had to pay.
