

1 Testimony in Support of House Bill 1553

2 Chairman Heinert members of the committee, thank you for the opportunity to testify today. I am

3 here in support of **House Bill 1553**, which seeks to provide school meals at no cost to all

4 students in North Dakota's public and nonpublic schools.

5 Ensuring that all students have access to nutritious meals is **not just a matter of policy—it is a**

matter of equity, student well-being, and academic success. Research consistently shows that
 students who are well-nourished are better able to concentrate, engage in learning, and succeed

academically. This bill removes barriers that many families face, ensuring that no child is left
behind due to financial constraints. THIS BILL MATTERS

10	1.	Eliminates Stigma & Supports Dignity
11		• By providing meals at no cost to all students, this bill prevents the stigmatization
12		of children who receive free or reduced-price meals.
13		• No student should have to experience embarrassment or be singled out due to
14		their family's financial situation.
15	2.	Reduces Administrative Burden
16		• The current system requires schools to process applications, track payments, and
17		manage unpaid meal balances.
18		• A universal school meal program simplifies operations and allows schools to
19		focus on education rather than meal debt collection.
20	3.	Improves Learning & Classroom Behavior
21		• Hunger is a learning barrier. Children who are not hungry perform better
22		academically, show improved behavior, and have fewer disciplinary issues.
23	4.	Respects Local Control While Providing State Support
24		• School districts will continue managing their meal programs, while the state
25		allocates necessary funding to ensure meals remain free for all students.
26		• This allows local schools to focus on quality meal service rather than financial
27		constraints.
28	5.	Utilizes Legacy Fund Earnings for Long-Term Investment in Education
29		• HB 1553 responsibly directs \$140 million from the Legacy Earnings Fund to
30		cover school meal costs, ensuring a sustainable funding source without
31		burdening local taxpayers.
32		• This is an investment in North Dakota's children, workforce, and future
33	Everv	child deserves to learn with dignity, free from hunger or stigma. HB 1553 is a
34	-	ical, responsible, and compassionate step toward making North Dakota's schools places
35	-	every student has the nutrition they need to thrive.
