## 1 HB 1607– EEA Bill

- 4 Education Committee. For the record, my name is Mike Bitz. I
- 5 am fortunate to serve as the superintendent for Mandan Public
- 6 Schools. Thank you for all you do to support education in ND. I
- am here today to oppose HB1607. I will be brief.

This bill appropriates \$179,000,000 to private schools without 9 private schools having to account for a nickel of how the 10 appropriation is spent. The only fiscal accountability is the ability 11 for DPI to audit the EEA of the parent. – As a Conservative and a 12 ND taxpayer, I will tell you that this is not only bad government, 13 it is wrong. ND has great private schools, with good people 14 working in them, but giving anyone \$179,000,000 without any 15 fiscal accountability is a bad idea. If you approve this bill, please 16 put guardrails in place to ensure full accountability for these 17 dollars. The taxpayers of ND deserve this. 18

ND has great private schools, and no one is arguing that parents should not be able to send their children to these great schools. However I find in confusing that the legislature is also considering a parents right bill that in its current form will not

apply to private schools even if they accept public dollars. If 1 private schools accept public dollars (and these are public dollars 2 as evidenced by the fiscal note attached to this bill), shouldn't we 3 expect them to open their board meetings and welcome parents to 4 attend, and have the ability to address the board? Should parents 5 really need to forfeit their rights as parents if the private school 6 chooses to admit their child? I think the overwhelming majority 7 of ND residents can agree that Accepting public dollars means 8 accepting public accountability! 9

Thank you for the opportunity to speak to you today. I urge you to vote NO on HB1607. At a minimum if you are going to approve this bill, amend it and give taxpayers the fiscal accountability they deserve. I would be happy to stand for any questions.
