Chairman Ruby and Committee Members, I'm Courtney Koebele and I serve as executive director of the North Dakota Medical Association. The North Dakota Medical Association is the professional membership organization for North Dakota physicians, residents, and medical students. NDMA opposes HB 1457 for the following reasons:

- The state of North Dakota already allows for medical, religious, or philosophical vaccine exemptions, so this bill would be largely unnecessary due to this fact.
- Another aspect of this bill that is greatly unnecessary is the requirement of the NDHHS
 being required to post vaccine injuries and rates of these presumed vaccine injuries as this
 type of data is already tracked by Vaccine Adverse Event Reporting System (VAERS)
 and the NDHHS website links to this website.
- The National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program and Public Readiness and
 Emergency Preparedness (PREP) Act/Countermeasures Injury Compensation Program
 were developed to address compensation for vaccine injury claims in which the
 individual was found to be injured by the VICP- or CICP-covered vaccine. These
 programs were created to avoid potential resurgence of vaccine preventable diseases.
