4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 34-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 7 Unauthorized workers Prohibition Penalty.
- 8 1. As used in this section:
 - a. "Business license" means a license, permit, registration, or other authorization required by law for a business to operate in the state.
 - b. "Private employer" means a person transacting business in the state, which
 employs one or more individuals.
- 13 <u>c. "Unauthorized worker" means an unauthorized alien as defined by 8 U.S.C.</u>
 14 Section 1324a(h)(3).
- 15 <u>2. A private employer may not willfully hire for employment an unauthorized worker or continue to</u>
- employ an individual, knowing the individual that has become an unauthorized worker.
- 17 <u>3. The labor commissioner shall investigate an An alleged violation under this section may be filed by an individual with the attorney general and the attorney general may investigate the alleged violation. - 4. A person who violates this section is subject to a civil penalty not to exceed:
 - <u>a.</u> Five Two thousand dollars and the suspension of the person's business license until
 the unauthorized worker's employment is terminated, if it is the person's first

- b. Ten Five thousand dollars and the suspension of the person's business license for
 six months, if it is the person's second offense under this section.
- 3 <u>c. Thirty Ten thousand dollars and the permanent revocation of the person's business</u>
- 4 <u>license</u>, if it is the person's third offense under this section.
