

Senate Bill 2307 would require librarians to remove ill-defined “explicit” materials from our library shelves. The bill’s censorship might extend to digital materials like eBooks and audiobooks that many of us access through our local library.

- 1)** No one can explain how the bill would be implemented.
- 2)** It would be costly to taxpayers. The attorney general would need additional staff to enforce this law.
- 3)** The library community already has a process in place to challenge materials since the Legislature passed HB 1205 in 2023.
- 4)** Let our professional librarians do their jobs. It is a waste of the Legislature’s time to focus on non-issues like this when there are real issues the state is facing.
