Dear Members of the North Dakota Senate,

I am writing to oppose SB 2307 as an unnecessary measure that will present huge difficulties for the vast majority of North Dakota libraries that are small, rural, one-room institutions. How will these libraries comply? Will they be unable to have books that are judged to be suitable for adults because those libraries do not have a way to create physical barriers between adult and non-adult sections? All libraries already have policies that allow patrons object to titles in the collection. Why is this needed? Is there really a problem?
