Testimony Opposing SB 2307

- Limited Collection Development: Libraries may refrain from purchasing materials with any sexual content, impacting access to essential resources in art, health, and other subjects.
- Discontinued Digital Services: Popular digital services and research databases could be discontinued if digital age verification systems cannot be implemented.

These restrictions would undermine the library's ability to serve as a welcoming and informative space for all members of the community. I urge you to reject SB 2307 and support our libraries.
